Miramar College Hosts Equity Summit Honoring Dr. Carroll

Miramar College held its first annual Equity Summit featuring "The Constance M. Carroll Lecture Series" Oct. 28-29. The Summit also featured the 2021 ASG Art for Equity Scholarship and Art Contest. Dr. Carroll served 17 years as the District Chancellor. She retired from her position on June 30, 2021.

The Equity Summit was a two-day event held on the evening of Thursday, Oct. 28 and during the day on Friday, Oct. 29. The evening event featured the lecture series with Chancellor Emerita Carroll and Associated Student Government presenting the winner of the Student Art Contest, who was Santiago Lopez. On Friday, Oct. 29, Chancellor Emerita Carroll provided the plenary address and the campus engaged in several presentations and workshops connecting to the theme, Leading for Equity - Embracing Diversity and Community at Miramar College. Chancellor's Forum

Our first ever Chancellor's Forum with new Chancellor Dr. Carlos O. Turner Cortez was held on the afternoon of Oct. 25. The near two-hour event discussed a number of topics and featured several presenters from the district. Some key points:

Chancellor Cortez acknowledged the unique challenges Miramar College has experienced over the years.

SDCCD is 8th largest employer in San Diego County. The San Diego College of Continuing Education is the largest feeder to the three credit colleges. Traditionally, high schools are the top feeder to community colleges.

Latinx makes up the largest portion of students served at the credit colleges. The gender make up of the credit colleges is 54.8% female, 44.6% male, 0.5% unreported and 0.1% non-binary.

Districtwide final FTES for 2020-2021 was 26,947 for credit college resident. 36,869 total when you add in non-credit and non-resident.

Miramar College FTES for 2020-2021 was 7,894, but the College achieved just over 10,000 FTES when the district spreads out the College of Continuing Education FTES for reporting purposes. This was used a few years back to recategorize Miramar College from a small college to a mid-sized college. The preliminary resident FTES targets for 2021-2022 for Miramar College is 9,670 (7,461 FTES+1,209 in-service FTES).

Dr. Susan Topham discussed AB 927, which removed the pilot status of the community college baccalaureate program and the San Diego Promise program, which has enrolled 3,980 students over its first two co-horts. She also broke down the enrollment numbers as they pertained to the pandemic. It was a fascinating look at which student populations dropped out and where they were gains. The District did receive \$86 million in HEERF funding. Over \$18 million has been distributed already to our students.

Vice Chancellor, Human Resources Greg Smith gave a COVID-19 update. Jan. 3, 2022 is still the target for a full reopening for the district and its colleges. Dec. 1, 2021 is the deadline for all employees to be vaccinated or to have an approved exemption. Employees who fail to comply will be subject to discipline. VC Smith discussed the safety precautions being taken by the district and the benefits to employees. Paid leave for COVID-19 related issues will be extended until Dec. 31, 2021. There is no requirement at this time to get a booster shot, but that could change with additional guidance handed down by the CDC. Students will not be able to enroll for a class, with an in-person component, this spring without uploading their proof of vaccination.

Executive Vice Chancellor Bonnie Ann Dowd provide a complex view of the budget and the state's new funding formula. The District understands what its expenses are for the 2020-2021 year, but won't know its revenue numbers until about 8 months into the fiscal year. The 2021-22 adopted budget, approved by the Board of Trustees on Sept. 9, 2021, is \$872,449,308. A breakdown can be viewed on page 46 of the presentation. Miramar's total general fund unrestricted & restricted allocations budget for 2021-22 is \$78,379,863.00. On page 49, VC Dowd outlines the major budget challenges (CalSTRS/CalPERS/COVID-19 impacts/"Hold Harmless").

Vice Chancellor, Facilities Management Chris Manis went over facilities.

Miramar College to Offer Intercollegiate Beach Volleyball Program in 2023

Miramar College announced in October that it will soon offer beach volleyball as its seventh intercollegiate sport. The San Diego Community College District Board of Trustees unanimously approved the development and implementation of a women's beach volleyball program at its Oct. 7, 2021 board meeting.



Given its large base of participation and popularity in the surrounding colleges and high schools, the sport of women's beach volleyball is one of the fastest growing sports. The California Community College Athletic Association (CCCAA) currently has 36 college teams competing. Currently, five local community college teams compete in women's beach volleyball (San Diego Mesa College, San Diego City College, Grossmont College, Palomar College, and MiraCosta College).

San Diego Miramar College currently fields a women's indoor volleyball team and adding a beach volleyball team will help complete and compliment both programs. The college also offers state-of-the-art facilities and staffing to support an intercollegiate women's beach volleyball team.

The JETS expect to field a team for the start of the 2023 season. They will play their home matches at the new (under construction) four-court facility located on campus.

New Round of HEERF Funding

Another round of HEERF/CARES Act funding was distributed to Miramar College students through the Edquity app this month. Students had between Oct. 14-19 to apply for the funds. The college had 1,429 applicants awarded a total of \$1.429 million dollars. Eligible students received a \$1,000.00 grant.

As authorized by the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act of 2021, Miramar College is offering students emergency relief grants for those experiencing financial need as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Students enrolled in at least one unit for the Fall 2021 semester are eligible to apply for emergency grants.

The next round of funding for the Fall 2021 term will open

up Nov. 10-20. A third round of funding is likely to open in December. Student are eligible for only one grant per semester.

Art Display at ACCT

Get Vaxxed and Win Awards

On Oct. 13, several of the 460 winners came to campus to claim their prizes for submitting their vaccination

records. The College sponsored an "I Won" campaign along with the other district institutions. Students where incentivized to upload their vaccine records starting with an October opportunity drawing for those who submitted prior to Sept. 27. As of Sept



27, 3,003 Miramar College students had submitted their proof of vaccination. Awards included 10 laptops, 10 tablets, 100 \$200 Visa gift cards and 250 \$100 Visa gift

ASG Gathers In-Person

For the first time since March 2020, the Associated Student Government held an in-person meeting. The Miramar College Associated Student Government meets every Friday, 9–11am. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the ASG is operating in a hybrid format.




October is Filipinx-American History Month
