ACTION ITEMS

5.1 (Slides 4-5): Another round of voting for adjunct senators concluded on Friday, Sept 23rd. There were three new nominees put forward

- Kristen Everhart
- Natalie Bickett

Results from that election should be announced in the upcoming meeting. And we will then have full representation of Adjunct Senators.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

6.1 (slides 6-16): Web Academy

- Kurt Hill shared a lot of information with us about the process of getting content onto the school's webpage. One of the bits that he shared with us was about the college calendar on the school's homepage. We were asked to be mindful of the categories we use to label items that are included in the calendar. He asked that we not label things as "Important Events" without getting that okayed first by Steve Quis.
- For our individual departments/majors, he let us know that Program Pages have to stick to a specific template which aligns with the catalog. However, there is a sidebar on each Program Page called "Program Information" and we are able to add pages there that allow us to include more information that don't have to stick to the same rigid style guide.

6.2 (slide 17) Faculty Representation

• If you have any ideas on how to aid our Adjunct Senators in better representing all their constituents, please let Pablo know. We've created the voting sheet for Contract Faculty Senators to take back to their departments to tally votes and better represent the voices of their colleagues. It's a little more difficult to do that with adjuncts since they are spread out across all the schools/departments and represent so many more faculty. So, we are requesting suggestions on how to better help our Adjunct Senators to be able to connect with and represent the large adjunct body.

6.3 (slides 18-22): Potential Scheduling Conflicts with College Hour

• A number of STEM faculty members shared with us concerns they have with scheduling issues and College Hour. For STEM, a typical course includes a lecture followed by a lab. Traditionally, there is a small break in between those. But with classes scheduled around College Hour, that break between lecture and lab has increased to an hour. Enrollment in those particular classes were very low this semester. Students in general, want to take the class and have the lab immediately after. They don't seem to want the large break provided for College Hour. So, it has been proposed that we have an open forum to come up with ideas and solutions. There is not a date yet for the forum, but please be on the lookout for that. And also come up with ideas that might help with this concern for scheduling conflicts with lecture/labs and College Hour.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORTS

7.1.1 (slides 24 and 25): Senators, please review the process for making motions and voting. For those that are new, this can all be a little confusing. Pablo's slideshow includes information on how to make a motion/vote.

7.1.2 (slide 31): If you are serving as a committee chair, make sure to reply to the email that Carmen Carrasquillo has or will send you about your committee's plan for committee composition and staggering term limits. As Senators, it would be good to pass this along to your departments in case some committee chairs are there.

7.1.4 (slide 31): Amy Alsup gave a reminder to adjuncts to send in their committee service hours to their Dean's office for compensation. At the beginning of the semester, you filled out a Shared Process Guidelines form with your committee chair. In that, you should have estimated the number of hours you would serve on that committee. So, now at the end of the month, you should provide the Dean's office with a summary of the hours you actually served. And if the hours are more or less than what you had estimated, just make sure to clarify that when submitting your hours.
