

Accreditation Standards. ACCJC reviews (and if needed, revises) its Accreditation Standards every 10 years, in accordance with policy. The revised Standards are designed to focus our continuous quality improvement efforts around the critical elements of student learning, student achievement, and the closure of institutional equity gaps.
