## **ACTION ITEMS**

#### 5.2: Land Acknowledgment (see slide 6)

- It is being proposed that we give our blessing to move this forward to College Council.
- Laura Gonzalez shared with us the results of a couple years of work by the Land Acknowledgement Task Force, and we were presented with the first reading of the proposed Land Acknowledgement that will go on the LEAD website. There are a couple of items that would be good for you to review and share with your departments.

- Just a couple of notes that were brought up by Laura G in our meeting. This has already been approved by Classified Senate and Associated Students last year. And similar acknowledgements are already in place at City and Mesa.

#### 5.3: Student Equity Plan Update/Draft (see slides 7-10)

- Nessa Julian, on behalf of the LEAD office and IDEA committee, presented the current draft of the Student Equity Plan. Per the State, the emphasis in this plan has focused on race consciousness. So, the draft presents a plan to address disproportionately impacted students here at Miramar. Based on research/statistics, our Latinx and Black/African American students are the ones most disproportionately impacted and will be the main focus of this plan. But Nessa also pointed out that the proposed plan will also help us in reaching out to other disproportionately impacted groups on our campus.

#### 5.4: SDCCD-Wide Resolution: IT Updates for College Classrooms and Faculty Offices (slide 11)

Basically it is drawing attention to technology updates needed in the District classrooms and faculty offices. Updates have not been in compliance with what is stated in the Collective Bargaining Agreement. #### 5.5: First Read, Quality Program Review (slides 12-15)

- The new Quality Program Review process was created with the mindset of completing Program Review to create quality programs based on evidence-based decision-making instead of just completing Program Review for resources and money. Patti Manley shared with us a template to be used within the Program Review process to guide us towards creating quality programs.
- For some background, this has been approved previously by the PROA Subcommittee and the PRIELT Committee. After being presented to and approved by other constituency groups, the goal is to present it to the College Council on 11/8 and have the template approved before our move from Taskstream to Nuventive.
- If this is approved, it will not be in effect for our upcoming Spring Program Review updates. Implementation of the template will begin in Spring 2024 with trainings being offered starting in Spring 2023.
