1	Update on Discussion of Our Committee's <u>Charge</u> (5 min) D. Tran said P. Martin met with M. Wolfson, K. Reinstein, and him. A main agreement from the meeting was that some charges were both operational and governance in nature.	I, II, III, V	I, II, IV	D. Tran
2	Becoming student-ready: Looking at Distance Education Enrollments and Outcomes (20 min) M. Wolfson indicated that there were success gaps for DI groups: success in online classes were 71% below on-campus ones. I. Martin asked if the gap was due to technology access, modality, class schedule, or wrong enrollment. N. Julian added that certain district workgroups (such as Black Student Success) were trying to get qualitative responses in the future. I. Martin commented that there might be different responses in surveys conducted during the pandemic and now. D. Tran added that a DE instruction refresher was needed for faculty. I. 	were culturally relevant, and send list of resources to students. D. Tran said that we needed to recognize cultural wealth and collectivist culture. I. Martin asked if discussions about culturally responsive practices were happening in various departments. N. Julian said that conversations in COIs were happening and that the ACPs were launching. N. Julian added that disaggregated data were being looked at. I. Martin said that there were so many ways and angles to cover such as grading for equity and students with their own support system. N. Julian added that, during a campus read, someone suggested reaching out to students before considering dropping them.
