- K. <u>"Increasing the Enrollment, Retention, and Success of Men of Color in Community</u> <u>Colleges"</u>: Over the last decade, two-year institutions have seen a steep decline in student enrollment rates, which has been exacerbated due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The decline in enrollment is especially significant among men of color. In response to the issues that complicate the enrollment, retention, and success of men of color, the <u>Association of Community College Trustees</u> (ACCT) and SDSU's <u>Community College Equity Assessment Lab</u> (CCEAL) published a brief that explores underlying factors driving these trends, as well as successful strategies to best support men of color that are already working in the field.

The ASCCC Open Educational Resources Initiative (ASCCC OERI) has prepared a ZTC Program overview document (<u>Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) Program Overview: What we think we know</u>) that summarizes what we know at this time. We hope you and your academic senate will rely on your local Open Educational Resources (OER) Liaison's expertise as your college develops plans for the use of the ZTC funds.
