President's Report: State, District, Campus, and Senate Issues Campus

- 1. Summary from the Academic Success Committee, re. their Spring 2023 meetings:
 - a. In our February 3rd meeting, we discussed ideas for creating a foundation of cultural humility and commitment to campus engagement. Committee members brought up unconscious bias training, professional development having a cultural humility component, and asking Laura Pecenco for a cultural humility template.
 - b. In our March 3rd meeting, Nessa presented the College Governance Handbook (CGH) Taskforce ASC/SEEM Committee recommendation. This was the start of a process to merge both committees.
 - c. In our April 7th meeting, we finalizing the proposal for a new committee called the Success Across the Curriculum Committee. It was submitted to Pablo.
- 2. The A.S. and the C.C. both voted unanimously to create a "Workgroup to Explore 'Packaged' Programs" that will include: 1 Faculty representative from each ACP (7-8 total), 1-2 Counselors, 1-2 Deans, the V.P. of Instruction or designee, and the V.P. of Dean of Student Services or designee. Look for a call out for participants shortly.
- 3. As a result of discussions around Academic Webpages, Miramar is putting together a Website Review Taskforce. Their objective is to collect and provide specific feedback to webservices regarding areas of the website that can be improved upon. <u>This interest form</u> will close on Monday, April 24th.

The <u>AB 1111: Common Course Numbering Task Force</u> continues to meet to create a set of recommendations for a plan to fulfill the intent of this legislation. Early meetings have focused on creating a common understanding of expectations within AB 1111 and a review of common course numbering efforts within selected districts and C-ID. The ASCCC will share more information as recommendations take shape.
- 5. ASCCC Disciplines List Revision Process: this process, initiated every February with the deadline for proposals at the end of September, establishes the minimum qualifications for the faculty of California community colleges. You are invited to participate. The ASCCC is currently accepting proposals to revise the Disciplines List for the 2023-2024 cycle. In spring 2022, proposals for Native American/American Indian Studies, Asian American Studies, and Nanotechnology were accepted and recommended for inclusion in the Minimum Qualifications Handbook.
