President's Report: State, District, Campus, and Senate Issues Campus:

- 1. The A.S. Exec has heard folx concerns around class cancellations and potential impacts to programs. We are therefore recommending that the EMC create a workgroup to assess/explore class cancellation process/issues and parameters when new programs are being developed.

- Anticipate changes to the Campus Allocation Model, driven by the Student-Centered Funding Formula (SCFF).
- Awarded \$250k from The Conrad Prebys Foundation to reimburse students for licensure fees. Allocation TBD. But good news for students.
- Also applying for another grant of \$250k to support student basic needs (second round of funding); in contact with VPSS's and Basic Needs Coordinators so she can target the grant toward specific metrics.
- Conversation about food services operations. Currently going into negotiations with a lease organization that will be responsible for providing all food services on campus. Should lower expenses and provide a profit. Should expand hours and catering services. Changes will not be immediate. Expect incremental increases once the lease agreement is signed.

The first meeting was very productive and we hope to have an updated AP for you at our next A.S. meeting.

- 11. ASCCC Exemplary Program Award Nominations: The theme for the 2023-24 Exemplary Program Award is "Excellence in promotion and advancement of Ethnic Studies." Excellence in this area will be demonstrated by understanding the experiences, challenges, and thought processes of students, and the promotion of efforts to teach ethnic studies centered on African American, Chicano/Latino, Asian American, and Native American courses which enable students to learn about their own stories.
