

Program Viability Workgroup Summary Report (Draft)

“Graphics Program Discontinuance”

In Spring 2023, in accordance with Miramar College’s Program Viability Discontinuance process, Vice President Odu and Dean of Liberal Arts, Lou Ascione, forwarded a recommendation to the Program Review and Outcomes Assessment subcommittee that the Graphics Visual Production program at Miramar College be considered for discontinuance under this procedure.

The Program Review and Outcomes Subcommittee and the Planning Institutional Effectiveness and Research Committee approved the formation of the Program Viability Workgroup in according with the Program Viability Process.

Program under consideration: Graphics – Visual Production

The program consists of one award as shown below:

Graphics – Visual Production, Certificate of Performance (15 Units)

The reasons cited for discontinuance include:

1. Significant Downward Trend in Course enrollment
 - a. Enrollment in the Graphics courses has consistently fallen below the expected numbers for minimum enrollment requirement. Workgroup members are reminded that >20 students per course is the general recommended capacity.
 - b. Attempts have been made to permit classes to run below minimum enrollment in an effort to support program viability.
 - c. The attached Data Analysis document completed by the Institutional Research office illustrates the ongoing low enrollment problem and associated FTES (Full Term Equivalent Student) generation.
2. Significant Downward Trend in Program Enrollment
 - a. There has been a significant decline in program enrollments. Over the last seven years only 2 students have earned an award. This timeframe predates the COVID-19 crisis by four years.
 - b. According to the data, no existing students are not declaring Graphics as a program of study.
 - c. The attached Data Analysis document completed by the Institutional Research office illustrates the ongoing low enrollment problem and associated FTES (Full Term Equivalent Student) generation.

Information:

1. Course enrollment in Graphics has been very low for several years. Courses have been allowed to run at small numbers to support the program; however, those efforts have failed to result in viable course enrollment numbers.
2. The number of students pursuing the Certificate of Performance award in this program has declined.
3. The number of students currently pursuing this program is below the number needed to support a full section of any individual course. If applicable, existing students can be accommodated by enrolling in a comparable course through another college in the SDCCD district.
4. Projected Impact on Students: Minimal and mitigation strategies are in place.
 - a. During the past seven years, only 2 students have earned the award.
 - b. GRFX courses do not satisfy transfer GE requirements. However, they are CSU transferrable.
 - c. Other programs and courses in the San Diego Community College District at City or Mesa Colleges can support students seeking graphics production positions in our community.
5. Labor Market Demand (The Program is not a CTE program; There are no Program Advisory Committees, Advisory Groups)
6. A recommendation to discontinue the program will occur if it is concluded that the program is no longer viable for the College, its students and the community.

Miramar College Graphics Program Discontinuance Plan

Brief Background:

The Miramar College Graphics Program was originally created in 2007 to be a non-aligned graphic arts program in the San Diego Community College District. This means that it had to be significantly different from the programs at City and Mesa College. At that time, the distinction between the programs was that the City College graphic arts program focused on teaching graphic art as a subset of visual arts and offered a transfer degree. Mesa College focused on multi-media production and offered a transfer degree. Miramar College took a more career-based approach and focused on document creation and production; however, this program was only formally a CTE program for two years.

The Graphics Program at Miramar College began as a component part of the Art/Visual Studies AA degree for transfer for which certain graphic arts courses were required to complete this degree. These courses were borrowed from City College until Miramar could develop its own curriculum.

By 2012 the Graphics program at Miramar offered its own Certificate of Achievement and AA Degree in Graphics and it was no longer a component of the Art/Visual Studies AA degree. Both the certificate and the AA degree were designed to be CTE oriented. Below is the catalog description that remained unchanged for the duration of this program:

This certificate/degree provides the graduate with the demonstrable skills, documented experience, a portfolio of evidence, and the personal confidence to enter a career in which the ability to create, produce, and effectively use graphic identity and communications is a critical requirement. The program is task-oriented, intended to provide “embedded skills” beneficial to most careers.

In 2016 a Certificate of Performance was added to the Graphics program (due to the low number of students completing the CA or the AA), and by 2019 we only had a Certificate of Performance which included the following courses:

GRFX 110 Introduction to Producing Computer aided Graphics 3

GRFX 120 Typography - Introduction to Creating Readability 3

GRFX 160 Vector Art 01: Illustration 3

GRFX 170 Raster Art 01: Image Editing 3

GRFX 181 Projects 01: Multi-modal Productions 3

At this time, this is the currently entirety of the program.

In Spring of 2019, the District was directed to go remote wherever possible. The sole contract instructor informed us that these courses cannot be taught online as they require “hands-on” training that prepares students to work in a studio or office setting. Once we came back to campus, we have been unable to fill a single section of graphics courses. In order to keep the instructor teaching graphics of some sort, we borrowed a course from City College that is approved to be taught online. From the beginning, we have had no problem filling multiple sections of this course. Unfortunately, we must give this course up as City College is reworking their curriculum, and it is also a violation of the non-compete agreement that we have with the other colleges in terms of curriculum.

Our current issues with the graphics program at Miramar College are the following:

- (1) The Graphics Program does not offer students a path to transfer, and it does not have a formal CTE designation, so it does not offer any clear career paths for students.
- (2) None of the courses in the program are approved to be taught online, and (according to the faculty) are not able to be taught online.
- (3) As a result, we have not been able to serve any Miramar students in 4 years.
- (4) The current curriculum we are teaching does not belong to Miramar College.
- (5) We have been using it due to a short-term, emergency curriculum loan from City College, and they have requested that we deactivate this course immediately.
- (6) We only have the fall semester left to run this City College course.

Recommendations

Several attempts have been made to help salvage the program, including changing the 4-letter discipline indicator from ARTD to GRFX, and attempting to create new courses. However, the fact that our program is not suitable for online offering, the job market does not seem to support the focus of the program (i.e., basic skills in graphic arts), the program offers neither a path to transfer or careers for student, has limited our options for the viability of this program. It is therefore my recommendation that we discontinue this program as it has not been viable in many years, and it currently has little to offer students which is reflected in the almost complete lack of enrollment.

- Critically analyze primary and secondary sources in college-level essays, written assignments, and research papers.

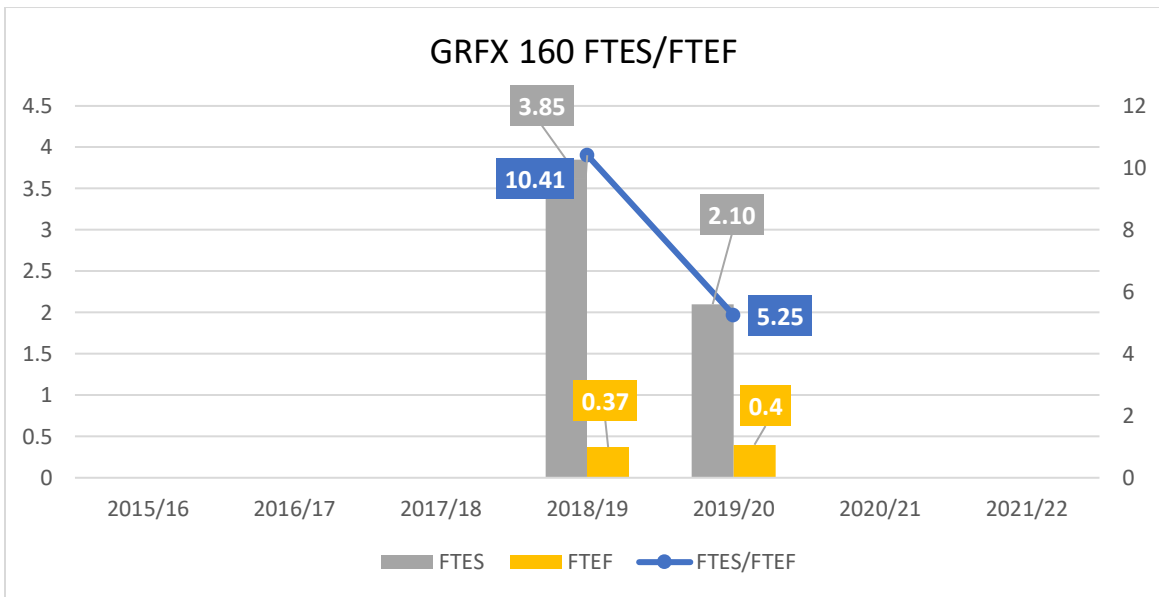
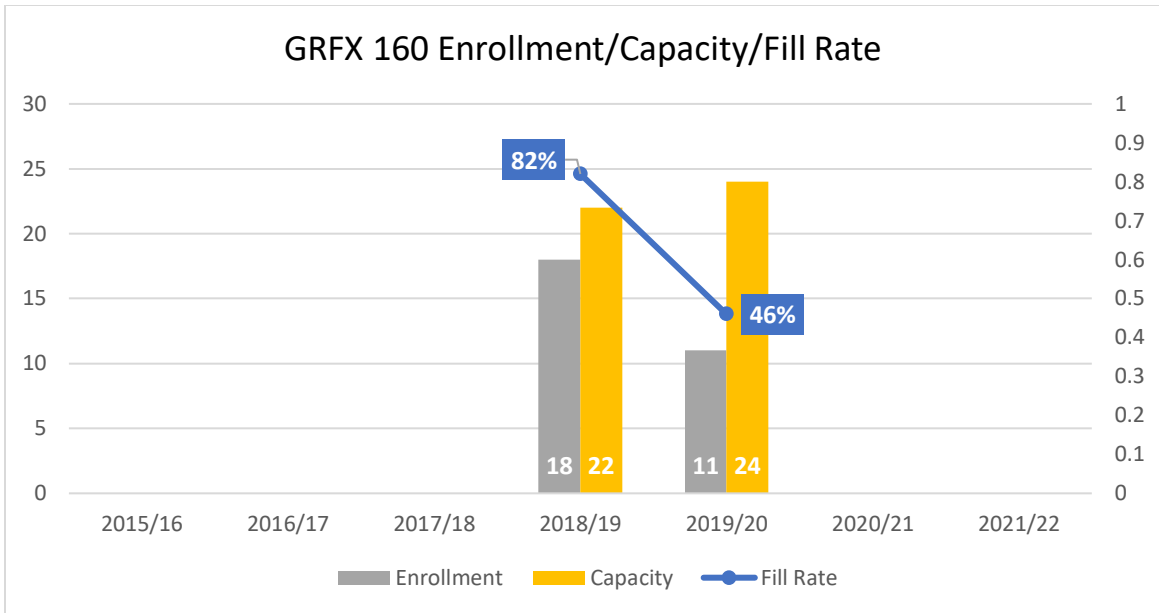

Hi Patti,

So far regarding the career component of the data you requested, the Graphics program has a career page with general advice for getting started in the field along with examples of potential careers for Graphics majors: <https://sdmiramar.edu/programs/graphics>. I reached out to our Career Center as well, to see if they have any specific career information or advising for careers in Graphics. When I briefly spoke to them in person, they said they did not have any relationships with specific companies that were hiring for Graphics-related positions, but that they would typically recommend Graphics students use Handshake to find employment opportunities. I'm hoping for additional information in response to my email. Lastly, I did a

quick search on Indeed to look at the local job market for Graphics-related careers and this is what I found:

- some entry level positions are focused on skillset and do not require a degree, though the skills desired can vary quite a bit between organizations (Adobe and Photoshop were common, but others were anything from AutoCAD to web design to 3D design)
- main fields with entry level opportunities related to Graphics are in Graphic Design, Production Assistant, Art and Graphic Supply Sales, and Pre-Press Technician
- many positions with higher pay (\$50,000+) require at least an Associate's if not a Bachelor's

I will follow up once I hear back from the Career Center, and please let me know if this is the type of data/information you are looking for.

To answer your question, the courses are GRFX 160, 170, 181, 158, and DSGN 100. The impact reports (if you click "Pi" in the PDF from my first email, that should show which awards these courses are requirements for.).

Let's see... what else did we talk about? Let me know if there's anything else I may just be forgetting...

The district has a September deadline for new curriculum for Fall 2024. In principle, proposals which are approved should be able to start effective in Fall 2024. (Walk-ins speed things up and can generally get submitted late with no problem). This is true for all of the ones Rex is working on with the exception of GRFX 158. 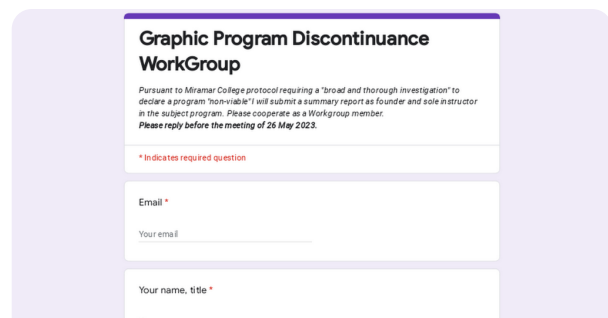
