San Diego Miramar College Academic Senate Primer: An Overview of How We Operate

President's Report: State, District, Campus, and Senate Issues Campus:

1. Call for workgroup participation:

- a. Miramar needs to appoint a CTE Liaison to work with the ASCCC. Please email Pablo and Carmen if you're interested in serving.
- b. Gender Equity workgroup: contact Vice-President Carrasquillo or Contract Member-at-Large Paulson (please see Vice-President Carrasquillo's report; relatedly, see below for more on <u>the 2023 Women's Equity Empowerment Certificate Program Application (100%</u> <u>Virtual</u>) and 9/7/23 conference held by the San Diego Chapter of the American Association of Women in Community Colleges (<u>SDCAAWCC</u>)).
- c. Adjunct Faculty Workgroup: Call for folx interested in serving on an adjunct survey results workgroup (please contact <u>Pablo</u> and/or <u>Kristen Everhart</u> if you are interested).
- d. Call out for a workgroup to revisit and revise the Student Code of Conduct and Board of Trustees Policy 3100, Student Rights, Responsibilities, Campus Safety and Administrative Due Process (please contact <u>Pablo</u> if you are interested).
 - i. At Über Chairs in Fall 2023, our Chairs requested that the Miramar College Academic Senate move to request a review and update of Board of Trustees Policy 3100, Student Rights, Responsibilities, Campus Safety and Administrative Due Process. (Items especially of concern relates to CCAP students, and the requirement for high school counselor involvement in matters of student conduct. This is considered a burden to the process, and is not addressed in BP 3100. Additionally, the updated BP 3100 should not be limited to student to student conduct, but also student to faculty conduct. The inclusion of Staff in this policy is also urged.)
 - ii. Also at Über Chairs, in Fall 2023, there was similar discussion and a request to revise the Student Code of Conduct with a focus on faculty safety and accountability for student behavior.
- e. Evaluation Process Revision Workgroup: Call out for a workgroup of folx who want to provide input for the AFT as they revisit the evaluation process. It would probably be helpful to have a union rep. A forum might also be a good idea to gather input (please contact <u>Pablo</u> if you are interested).
- f. College Council needs two faculty reps. to serve on a workgroup to help plan the Board of Trustees meeting being held at Miramar on March 14 (Pi Day!)

- 2. Any adjunct serving on any committee (or formal workgroup, as I understand) can be compensated for their work by the AFT so long as they fill out this form: <u>SDCCD AFT Adjunct</u> <u>Committee Service Form</u>.
- 3. House-keeping:
- a. FYI, correction to past minutes: the minutes from 10/18/22, 11/1/22, 11/15/22, 12/6/22, and 12/13 reflected inaccurate attendance. They have each been reposted to the website with the correct attendance.
- b. A.S. voting records are not posted in our minutes but they are always available from the secretary if anyone wishes to see them.
- c. Please take the <u>Miramar A.S. Senator Demographics Survey</u>. (It's to inform the folx at the <u>Research at the Campaign for College Opportunity</u> and their efforts to examine the diversity of California's educational leadership.)
- 4. I have heard that a number of faculty (and their students) are facing challenges with the online registration and admissions processes. I hope to know more about how the District and College are working to address those. I will share what I learn as soon as I hear more.
- 5. We want to remind you that the ASC offers a number of services for students. Please visit (and share!) their web page to learn more: <u>https://sdmiramar.edu/services/asc</u>.
- 6. Regarding the culture at Miramar: despite a lot of great results in our collective efforts to make our students feel welcome and supported, many of our employees are not feeling the "Miramar Love." This is evidenced by a number of POC & equity champions leaving Miramar in the past year. I've discussed this urgent matter with both President Wes and VPI Odu and they said that the best, most directly impactful action folx can take moving forward is to formally file complaints and report incidents. Wes informed me that he is also open to developing exit interviews, but we've been so busy since our meeting that I haven't been able to follow up with about that.
- 7. The Facilities, Health, & Safety Committee is requesting feedback from faculty regarding the <u>Public Art Procedures draft</u> that Hannah Pierce introduced in our last A.S. meeting. This draft is borrowed from City College, which has been successfully acquiring artwork for their campus. Please <u>discuss this draft</u> with your departments or adjunct faculty groups in your next department meeting. <u>Please email her feedback</u> (hpierce@sdccd.edu, by 10/21/23) regarding concerns, edits, and additions that your department thinks should be considered when finalizing this process for Miramar. She will report back to the Facilities, Health, & Safety Committee.
- 8. District folx have offered to present an overview of this at our Senate, but our A.S. Exec thought we would be best served by sharing that overview on our website instead: <u>BP and</u> <u>AP Overview.pptx</u>

9. Technology Updates:

- a. Need tech support? Use SDCCD's Service Desk Application (aka Universal Help Desk): "This system will allow requestors to connect directly with an agent, expediting problem resolution and fostering a seamless communication channel": <u>https://help.sdccd.edu/</u>
- b. A formal Technology Survey coming out of the Research Office after Census (all personnel will be asked to take it). The survey should take you between two and five minutes to complete. Be on the lookout for an email from Xi and Daniel.
- c. While the District's goal was to complete the WiFi upgrade project by July 31, 2023, there have been delays. According to the District Technology Committee: all switches have been upgraded but the installation of cabling and access points (APs) has not yet been completed. The estimated completion is now September 30 but it may be further delayed

until after winter break due to existing technical limitations of our network requiring multiple methods of access to our WiFi.

- d. Technology Issues Updates: Lisa Muñoz and I met with President Lundburg, V.P. Bell, Director Hill, Peter Maharaj, and a District Network Specialist at the end of May to share the various technology concerns faculty have been facing (<u>`Technology Requests and Goals SDMC 050123.pdf</u>"). We should be hearing updates on addressing those concerns through our regular reports from the Technology Committee.
- e. Based on those concerns, and through a collaborative effort led by the Accreditation Team, the ISER was updated before it went to the BoT: "<u>Updated ISER Section IIIC</u> <u>Technology Resources.pdf</u>"
- 10. If you are interested in writing a new OER textbook, the ASCCC is taking applications for funding (due September 15). Please contact me, Angela Boyd (our ASCCC OER Liaison), or the VPI's office if you are interested.
- 11. The details around the reorganization in the Office of Instruction are still being discussed and refined. You can see the current draft/proposal "<u>Office of Instruction Reorg BRAINSTORM</u> <u>DRAFT.pdf</u>" in the "Associated Documents" for today's meeting.
- 12. The 2023 Women's Equity Empowerment Certificate Program Application (100% Virtual) offers women the opportunity to learn the skills, knowledge, and ability to lead in the California Community Colleges system. Cohorts consist of six classes (two hours per class) with three options: Tuesdays, Sept 27 Nov 29 from 8 AM to 10 AM; COHORT 2: Wednesdays, Sept 28 Nov 30 from 12 PM to 2 PM; COHORT 3: Thursdays, Sept 29 Dec 1 from 8 AM to 10 AM. - Registration may have closed, but the San Diego Chapter of the American Association of Women in Community Colleges (<u>SDCAAWCC</u>) is holding its first conference on Thursday, September 7 and Friday, September 8 at Cuyamaca College and San Diego Mesa College. - 14. Updates from College Council (link to the recording, link to the agenda)
 - a. E2: ISER was submitted by the 8/1 deadline. Email will go out that it is complete and will include a link to the landing page. Preparing to meet with peer review team in September and October. We will receive an inquiry report for the focused site visit, which will be in February 2024.
 - b. E3: No report.
 - c. E4: [The Website Review Taskforce] had a good first meeting, identified what we want to look at. Pallek asked that departments go through their webpages to find and fix any dead links (this is not done automatically). Miramontez also asked that we ensure everything is up to date, but cautioned not to make any major changes before until after the site visit in February.
 - d. F1: Reviewed charged and membership. Somethings need to be cleaned up in the handbook (i.e. Grants is an ad hoc committee but is listed as a subcommittee of college council).
 - e. F2: Reviewed Strategic Enrollment Management plan. All agreed to add "recommended" before actions/strategies. Each constituency leader will bring to their respective bodies for review/approval. It will then come back to College Council for a first and second read, action will be taken, and the President will "bless it."
 - f. F3: Briefly reviewed last page of data packet, Action Items. Miramontez reported that we are implementing Element 451 in the Spring. Also had Jets Jump Start and two days of a resource fair.

- g. F4: Pallek shared that a portion of the proceeds from this year's Invest in Success will be allocated to Basic Needs. He plans to recommend 30% to the Foundation Board. Kunst will share the event information and encouraged folks to attend. Lundburg added that each sponsorship will come with two student tickets and there will be an activity for the donors to find their "sponsored" students.
- h. F5: All agreed to pulling a small taskforce together, comprised for two reps from each constituency, based on current membership, to start this conversation.
- i. F6: All agreed to March 14, 2024 as the on-campus Board meeting date. All agreed to assemble a workgroup comprised of two members form each constituency. Each constituency will put a call out and send names to Kunst.

District

- 15. The timeline for hiring a new chancellor is on track. Once identified, their proposed start date is 1/1/24.
- 16. SDCCD Branding Project: "In August, Selbert Perkins will start engaging with students, faculty, classified professionals, administrators, and a wide range of external partners and stakeholders to understand current perceptions of our District and colleges [to assess and, if appropriate, develop a new visual identity for the SDCCD]. A combination of individual interviews, focus groups, electronic surveys, and other methods will be used to engage the full diversity of our communities in this process. Your perspectives and input are valuable, and I hope you will participate." (from Acting Chancellor Smith's 8/10/23 email, "Chancellor's Message: SDCCD Branding Project Announcement")

- 18. The Division of Institutional Innovation and Effectiveness (II&E) has secured an institutional membership with the <u>VR/AR (Virtual Reality/Augmented Reality) Association</u>. Our membership with VRARA opens up an avenue of exclusive benefits for all SDCCD employees and, eventually, our students. - 19. The District is revising a number of Board Policies and Administrative Procedures. Of particular interest are those related to equivalencies (BP 7160 Professional Development and AP 7211 Faculty Service Areas, Minimum Qualifications, & Equivalencies. The Acting Chancellor invited all four A.S. Presidents to meet together, with folx from HR (People, Culture, and Technology Services) to review and establish clear protocols on how a new adjunct gets equivalency and how an existing contract faculty adds a new FSA (like Adrian did with Ethnic Studies, or I did with Sustainability).
- a. The ASPs are planning to work with the Acting Vice Chancellor of People, Culture, and Technology Services Office of People this semester to revise and update AP 7211.
