Completing a General Education pattern is one of the required components for transfer to most California State Universities. Other required transfer components include completion of 60 transferable semester units, grade point average, and coursework in preparation for the major. Please meet with a Counselor to obtain all the requirements for transfer to a CSU.

## GENERAL EDUCATION CERTIFICATION

- Certification of General Education courses is NOT automatic. Certification must be requested through the college Evaluations Office once the CSU GE pattern has been completed and students have been accepted to a CSU campus.
- Prior to GE certification, students must complete a minimum of 12 units in residence at the SDCCD colleges, or 3 units of general education transferable coursework from the CSU Certification Pattern.
- Official transcripts from all other accredited institutions attended must be on file and will be reviewed for inclusion in the certification process. A minimum of 39 semester units is required for a complete certification.
- Acceptable scores on the Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) exams and the College Level Examination Program (CLEP) may count towards satisfying CSUGE subject areas. Consult the College Catalog and a Counselor for details.
