




# Suggestions for Q1: Please check all the resources you feel should be offered in the 'Culture and Inclusion Center'




# Suggestions for Q2: Please check all the amenities you feel should be offered in the 'Culture and Inclusion Center'




# Suggestions for Q3: Please check all the campus events you feel should be offered in the 'Culture and Inclusion Center'




#### **Suggestions for Q4: Intersecting identities**




#### **Suggestions for Q5: Diverse Abilities**




#### Suggestions for Q6: Other diverse student populations


