If helping us complete tasks is what you want this committee to do, great, but consider changing the name to the Task Completion Assistance Committee. If you want to help faculty develop professionally, consider helping us attend conferences and workshops beyond a paltry \$1000 limit. Registration and air easily exceeds that limit. Hotel, incidentals? That is out of pocket every conference I attend. If your committee is now infused with money from the District and State, as was presented as a major reason to reformulate this committee, then allocate it to help us meaningfully develop professionally.
