RESTORATIVE JUSTICE PRACTICES

- Works to repair the harm to the relationships between those who caused harm, those who were harmed, and the community
- Seeks to understand and address the circumstances that contributed to the crime

BENEFITS OF RESTORATIVE PRACTICES

- Reduced likelihood of committing more harm (<u>CA</u> <u>Policy Lab</u>, 2022)
- Reduced exclusionary discipline & racial disparities in disciplinary practices/outcomes (<u>National</u> <u>Education Policy Center</u>, 2020)
- Improved climate, greater connectedness, improved academic performance (<u>WestEd</u>, 2019)

EXPLORATION IN RJ TRAINING

- Contacted USD Center for Restorative
 Justice, as they specialize in RJ training for higher education staff
 - Foundational RJ for Higher Ed training: 6
 weekly Zoom sessions + asynchronous
 exercises/material or 3 days in person
 - Estimate: <90 people in 3 cohorts:
 \$41,500-\$44,000l >90 in 4 cohorts:
 \$55,000-\$57,700


