This toolkit was created in collaboration with the National Indian Justice Center, California Indian Museum and Cultural Center,

California Indian Culture and Sovereignty Center, Naqmayam Communications and Foundation for California Community Colleges. The land acknowledgement statement was developed in partnership with the California Tribal Chairpersons' Association. Most importantly, this training provides historical and political context, important demographics and the processes and protocols for meaningful and consistent consultation with California Indian Tribes.
