




Employment by Year




Was your work experience directly related to your field of study?







How did attending Miramar College impact graduates?




How has Miramar contributed to student knowledge, skills, and personal development?



Broader education, independent learning, and critical/analytical thinking were the highest rated skills in development.







The library and academic success center are utilized more compared to previous years.


The use of tutoring services has increased compared with last year.





Usage of career center have increased slightly from last year. Usage of the registration office, counseling office and transfer center have decreased from last year.







Usage of San Diego Promise and Financial Aid have increased from last year. Usage of DSPS and EOPS services have increased significantly from last year.



Jet Fuel, Mental Health, On-Campus Events








Usage of Jet Fuel and Mental Health Services increased significantly from last year. Higher percentage of students also attended campus events during College Hour.

Usage of student health services, the student affairs office, and student clubs have all increased from previous year.




5-Year Average Utilization






Student Barriers



Are graduates currently employed?




Most graduates reported being employed after graduating from Miramar College. The employment rate of SDMC graduates is showing an upward trend from previous years Most employed students were employed full time.

Employed graduates (full- and part-time) plan to...



Employment plans in the next six months


Unemployed graduates plan to...

Education plans in the next six months




63% of graduates plan to transfer to a 4-year university.
