



Action Planning Themes

- Becoming ready to help
- Highlighting/improving resources

Ready to Help General Collegewide **Efforts** Resources

Overall Themes

1. Care:

Demonstrate to students that Miramar College cares about them through diversity and cultural awareness,
 provide welcoming physical spaces, removing barriers, and understanding their individual perspectives.

2. Ready to Help:

Support staff and faculty in becoming ready to help by organizing impactful professional development,
 meeting employee/department needs, providing the tools to become informed, and fostering collaboration.

3. Resources:

 Help students make the most of their college experience by spreading information of resources available and creating/enhancing programs at Miramar College.

4. General Collegewide Efforts:

• Increase efforts in high school outreach, effective communication, and campus engagement.

Action Planning Ideas

Care

Diversity and Cultural Awareness

- Celebrate diversity through inclusive events/fairs.
- Respond to students in culturally responsive ways.
- Share culturally diverse media on campus to foster inclusivity.

Spaces

- Provide visually appealing spaces that are student friendly and can be used for socializing and for clubs.
- Create a sense of belonging.
- Faculty can become more welcoming during office hours and by hosting student groups.

Remove Barriers

- Normalize support for multilingual students through phone options, forms, and translation services.
- Streamline processes through easy to understand language, visual cues, etc.
- Remove petition deadline.

Perspectives

- Listen to feedback and empathized with students.
- Encourage students to share their story and challenges.

General Care

- Care should be authentic.
- All students should feel served.
- Offer fresh and diverse food in cafeteria.
- Secret Shopper Program.
- Create a "lets find a way" culture to help students.

Action Planning Ideas

Ready to Help

Professional Development

- For faculty and classified professionals.
- Short sessions to easily process.
- Ongoing (during college hour/weekly/Fridays).
- Offer tracks that attract diverse interests.
- Authenticity, cultural awareness, well-coordinated.
- Include lunches.

Support Employees

- More/equitable staffing.
- Compensate bilingual staff.
- Meet needs.
- Diverse staff.
- Simplify processes applications, etc.

Become Informed

- Self-informed or through training.
- Understand privilege race, position of power, education, etc.
- Academic and Career Pathways (ACPs).
- Gain student perspectives through mock student accounts on Canvas and through surveys.
- Receive relevant, easy to understand data.

Collaboration

- Invite HSI STEM counselors to classrooms.
- Task force with representation from each department.

Action Planning Ideas

Information Expand awareness of resources - tours, website, media/materials. Connect students to Jets Jumpstart (HSI Intentionality). Internship opportunities.
