Common Course Numbering (CCN)

- Assembly Bill 1111 and Education Code 66725
- Phase 1 of 3 Launched Summer 2024
- “...To **streamline transfer** from two- to four-year postsecondary educational institutions and reduce excess credit accumulation, on or before July 1, 2024 (2027)* ...”
- CA Community Colleges shall adopt a **common course numbering system** (CCN) for all **general education** requirement courses and transfer pathway courses
- Each community college campus shall incorporate common course numbers from the adopted system in its **catalog**
- The CCN system shall be **student-facing**...and ensure that comparable courses across **all cc’s have the same number**

*proposed change AB 3290 extends deadline
