

3. Land Acknowledgment

We recognize that San Diego Miramar College sits on the ancestral homeland of the Kumeyaay people, who have lived in this area for well over 10,000 years, and we honor their past, present, and future connection to this land and its inherent connection to their identity.

We acknowledge our occupation of unceded Kumeyaay land and the violent systemic injustices this has continuously perpetuated for Native peoples of this region. We pay respect to the Indigenous people of San Diego County - past, present, and future - and honor their continuing presence in their homeland and their spiritual beliefs that land does not belong to people; people belong to land.

- 6.2. Concerns about the Implementation of the Faculty Service Area (FSA) Process at SDCCD (cont.)
 - California Code, Education Code, Section 87357, states "With regard to minimum qualifications for faculty, the board of governors shall consult with, and rely primarily on the advice and judgment of, the statewide Academic Senate."
 - The ASCCC stands for faculty and their Academic Senates determining equivalency and satisfying minimum qualifications.
 - The CBA that governs SDCCD, its faculty, and staff, states that any FSA approval will reflect that the faculty member meets the Minimum Qualifications for the discipline in question AND that the FSA Commission include "up to six (6) non-voting discipline specialists" to determine that.

6.2. Concerns about the Implementation of the FSA Process at SDCCD -Pablo Martin (15 mins. Discussion)

- In their review of a recent application, the SDCCD's FSA Commission did not meet any of these criteria.
- Nevertheless, the commission approved a new FSA for that faculty member, ostensibly giving them the right to teach in that discipline.
- To be clear, faculty discipline experts were not involved in this FSA process in any capacity that I am aware of. Nor has the faculty in question submitted a request for Equivalency through our established process.


- Services are mandated by Title 5 of Education Code, by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADAAA), and by Sections 504 and 508 of the Rehabilitation Act
- Services must be implemented in a timely manner that supports student's ability to access facilities and learning materials, demonstrate their knowledge, and participate fully in the college
- DSPS Counselors have specialized training that includes and exceeds counseling skills to include a depth of knowledge related to disability and law
- Faculty include: 1Program Coordinator, 1 Access Technolgy Specialist, 3 Contract Counselors, 3 Adjunct Counselors
- Services include authorization of accommodations, disability management counseling, and support in the development of self-advocacy and independence

- 2. Submit Verification of Disability Documentation
- 3. Complete Welcome Appointment with a DSPS Counselor

*Services must be activated each semester and may vary class to class.



Let's Collaborate!

Referrals with warm handoffs

Strategize with faculty about individualized methods/approaches/inclusive teaching strategies to support a student's learning
Provide training on disability topics at department meetings
Provide strategies for behavior management
Outreach-classroom visits and presentations

Reinforce/reiterate agreements and/or recommendations you have provided to the student
Assist with identification of essential elements in a course and provide options for appropriate accommodations

Faculty Resources

EOPS/CARE/NextUp & CalWORKS

- Started in 1960s to address the lack of educational equity for disproportionately impacted students pursuing a higher education
- Assembly Bill 164 (AB-164) established state funding to develop programs that would provide community college access to disadvantaged student
- Counseling is at the core of the program 3 counseling appointments per semester (intrusive counseling, referral to services, advocacy with the county)
- Provides wraparound services to students including some financial benefits and pro-active counseling and support -Guided Pathways modeled
- Faculty include: 1 Program Coordinator, 1 EOPS Counselor, 1 NextUp Counselor and 5 adjuncts (currently hiring for a CalWORKs/CARE Counselor)
