

3. Land Acknowledgment

We recognize that San Diego Miramar College sits on the ancestral homeland of the Kumeyaay people, who have lived in this area for well over 10,000 years, and we honor their past, present, and future connection to this land and its inherent connection to their identity.

We acknowledge our occupation of unceded Kumeyaay land and the violent systemic injustices this has continuously perpetuated for Native peoples of this region. We pay respect to the Indigenous people of San Diego County - past, present, and future - and honor their continuing presence in their homeland and their spiritual beliefs that land does not belong to people; people belong to land.

We also acknowledge that this is merely the beginning, and there is far more work to be done in an attempt to heal all of the injustices and inequities that still exist today and throughout their entire historical diaspora. Hopefully we can find a way to move forward together.



The above Mike Connolly historical *Kumeyaay Lands 1769-2000* map picture details the 2005 Indigenous California Indian tribes of the greater Southern California area and northern Baja California, Mexico, the Native American Indian reservations, and contrasts them with the Indigenous Kumeyaay territory of 1769 (gray area).

7.3.1: President's Report

Senators are also invited to complete the <u>A.S. Anonymous Feedback Form</u>.

1. Contingent faculty are invited to attend the ASRE's GIFTS Event on 11/8/24 from 12:30-2pm in K1-107 to provide access to an array of professional development education. Lunch will be provided (please RSVP), AFT reps are bringing swag, and FLEX credit is available.

- 2. We recently received input on our anonymous feedback form:
 - a. The concern was that faculty volunteers who are not selected for screening committee appointments are not always informed of this decision. They asked that this be addressed.
 - b. To clarify, the Committee on Committees (ConC) does not appoint faculty to screening committees. The ConC only gathers and then forwards the names of all interested faculty to the Dean coordinating the screening committee.
 - c. This process was created by the ConC and approved by the A.S. body in Fall 2022. (You can find those documents here, on the ConC Website).
- 3. Update on progress toward installing paper towel dispensers in the bathrooms on campus: installations have begun and should be completed by the end of November.

I. Review of President's Hiring Process

- ☐ The Dean, Department Chair, or the Committee on Committees will solicit faculty interest campus-wide in order to broaden and diversify the pool of volunteers. Faculty will have 10 business days (i.e. Monday through Friday) from the date of solicitation to express their interest. The solicitation will include the due date.
- ☐ If the **Dean or Department Chair** have made the solicitation, they will **forward their final selection** to the Committee on the Committees Chair. If the ConC Chair solicited interest, they will forward all faculty interest requests to the Dean and Department Chair. ****[The Committee on Committees does not select the screening committee members.]
- On the date of solicitation, the Committee on Committees Chair will also forward the DEI List to the Dean and Department Chair.

Report cont.: Vice President

- In establishing the screening committee roster, Department Chairs and Deans will review both the faculty interest requests and the "DEI List" of faculty volunteers when making their selection.
- The Dean/Department Chair will then forward their selected roster to the Committee on Committees Chair.
- The Committee on Committees Chair will then forward the roster and form to the College President for final approval.


