Tezozomoc is a poet, essayist, activist and performance artist from Los Angeles known for his powerful and evocative internationally published poetry exploring themes of social justice, identity, and the experiences of Chicano and Indigenous communities, deeply rooted in cultural heritage from the history and struggles of Mexican-American and Indigenous peoples, often addressing issues like migration, displacement, inequality, and environmental justice, blending these themes with personal and communal narratives. His most recent publication, *I Am Not Your Chihuahua*, is available by Amoxcalco Books.

His name, Tezozomoc, connects him to the historical figure of the same name, a ruler of the Tepanec people of ancient Mexico, adding another layer of cultural significance to his identity as a poet.

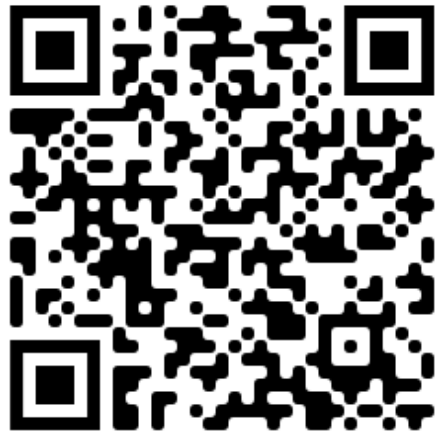

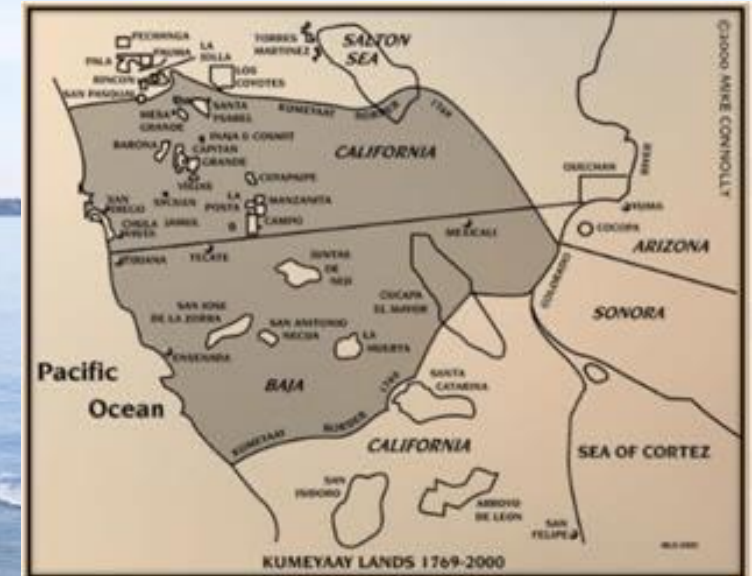


