Tezozomoc is a poet, essayist, activist and performance artist from Los Angeles known for his powerful and evocative internationally published poetry exploring themes of social justice, identity, and the experiences of Chicano and Indigenous communities, deeply rooted in cultural heritage from the history and struggles of Mexican-American and Indigenous peoples, often addressing issues like migration, displacement, inequality, and environmental justice, blending these themes with personal and communal narratives. His most recent publication, I Am Not Your Chihuahua, is available by Amoxcalco Books.

His name, Tezozomoc, connects him to the historical figure of the same name, a ruler of the Tepanec people of ancient Mexico, adding another layer of cultural significance to his identity as a poet.


AS Code of Conduct

3. Land Acknowledgment

We recognize that San Diego Miramar College sits on the ancestral homeland of the Kumeyaay people, who have lived in this area for well over 10,000 years, and we honor their past, present, and future connection to this land and its inherent connection to their identity.

We acknowledge our occupation of unceded Kumeyaay land and the violent systemic injustices this has continuously perpetuated for Native peoples of this region. We pay respect to the Indigenous people of San Diego County - past, present, and future - and honor their continuing presence in their homeland and their spiritual beliefs that land does not belong to people; people belong to land.

We also acknowledge that this is merely the beginning, and there is far more work to be done in an attempt to heal all of the injustices and inequities that still exist today and throughout their entire historical diaspora. Hopefully we can find a way to move forward together.

- The Vice President will finish that term as President and the Election Committee will conduct elections for a new Vice President immediately. 
