You have the **right** to feel **safe** and **accepted** here!

Title IX (9) is a federal law that prohibits the following:

## Sexual Assault

Sexual assault is:

- a forcible or non-forcible sex act or
- unwelcome sexual conduct

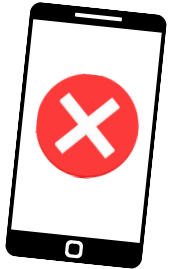
That occurs

- without consent
- when under the influence of drugs/alcohol
- while unconscious
- using physical force or threats



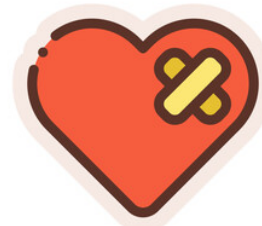
## Online Sexual Harassment

Online sexual harassment is the sharing of explicit images (sexting), pornography or other explicit content with or without consent, or by using coercion (extortion), threat or intimidation online.



## Dating Violence

Dating violence is violence committed by a person who is or was in a social, emotional, intimate, or romantic relationship with another person.



## Pregnant and Lactating Students

For students experiencing pregnancy or related conditions:

- Reasonable modifications to policies, practices, and procedures
- Voluntary access to a separate and comparable education program or activity
- Voluntary leave of absence
- Access and time to utilize a designated lactation space



## Sexual Harassment

Sexual harassment is unwelcome sexual conduct that prohibits a student's access to their education or school-related extracurricular activities.

### The Rights of Any Student Reporting Incidents of Sexual Harassment:

- to file a formal complaint
- be provided support services
- to an informal resolution option
- to explain and provide evidence related to their complaint
- to receive notice of the outcome of their complaint
- to receive information on how to appeal the decision

### The Rights of the Individual Named in the Complaint:

- to be informed of the claims brought forth against them
- be provided support services
- to an informal resolution
- to explain and provide evidence related to their complaint
- to receive notice of the outcome of their complaint
- to receive information on how to appeal the outcome of their complaint

### The Responsibilities of the Title IX Office:

- provide support services
- investigate allegations
- communicate the investigation outcome to impacted individuals
- maintain confidentiality
- implement appropriate corrective actions
