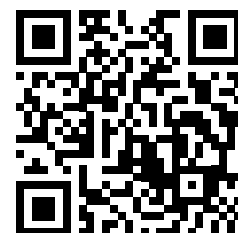
Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)/CA Dream Act Application

To apply, students must complete the **FAFSA** or CA Dream Act Application. If students can't complete either, they must use the Federal Student Aid Estimator Tool at studentaid.gov/aid-estimator, complete the Estimated SAI page and submit it. Students are also encouraged to share details about their financial situation in the "Other Financial Circumstances" section of the application. If extreme financial challenges prevent students from doing any of the above, they can explain their situation in the same section. If they are eligible, we may request more information for clarification.

- Four-year university
- Trade/vocational school in the United States

- Be graduating seniors attending or former graduates who attended a high school in Escondido, CA (including San Pasqual Academy in Escondido, CA) or Valley Center, CA that have attended such high school for 4 years
- Be graduating seniors from a private high school or community college students who have lived in Escondido or Valley Center for the 4-year period prior to graduation

- Be graduating San Diego County female (biologically from birth) high school seniors
- Plan to attend a four-year university in the United States in fall
- Have a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.25 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Have participated in San Diego varsity CIF cross-country and/or distance track (800 meters or greater) and plan to run cross-country and/or distance track (800 meters or greater) on a college or university NCAA competitive team
- Be United States citizens

- Plan to enroll full-time at an accredited four-year university or music academy in the United States in fall
- Be serious and talented musicians planning to pursue a career in music and/or play professionally (string instruments preferred)
- Have a minimum unweighted 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- Be United States citizens or permanent residents

1) Letter of recommendation (on official letterhead) from applicant's music teacher indicating his/her level of talent and seriousness about pursuing music as a career; (2) A URL link to a YouTube of applicant's music

Barton-Tomlinson Scholarship

- Have resided in San Diego County for at least one year
- Be students currently attending a community college who plan to transfer to San Diego State University in the fall of 2025
- Have a cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Have a demonstrated financial need
- Meaningful community service considered

Essay (maximum 250 words) describing the benefits you have enjoyed from being involved in sailing and your sailing accomplishments while in high school.

BLCI College Success Scholarship

BLCI College Success Scholarship applicants should:

- Be graduating high school seniors enrolled in the Barrio Logan College Institute
- Plan to enroll full-time at an accredited community college or university resulting in a bachelor's degree
- Have a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Exemplify leadership and commitment to their community
- Have a demonstrated financial need
- Agree to participate in required program activities, including monthly communications with the College and Career Success Specialist, mentorship and internship placement, and summer orientation program
- Make a personal commitment to give back to BLCI and their community during and after college in meaningful and creative ways including, but not limited to, participation in BLCI events, mentoring other BLCI students, or donating time and resources

- Have a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Plan to major in science, technology, engineering, math, nursing, gerontology, business/ accounting, construction management, or other related fields
- Demonstrate strong character and a high level of integrity
- Have a demonstrated financial need

Boulé Education Initiative Scholarship

Boulé Education Initiative Scholarship applicants should:

- Have resided in San Diego County for at least one year
- Be graduating high school seniors or community college transfer students who will enroll full-time at an accredited four-year university in the United States in fall

- Have achieved a minimum of 80% attendance at all BEI events and workshops, OR are current Links Achievers
- Have a commitment to serving their communities through extra-curricular activities, work, or community service

- Reside in California, though priority will be given to applicants who have resided in San Diego County for at least one year
- Be graduating high school seniors, current college students or graduate students
- Be majoring in Food Sciences; Dietetics; Nutrition; Food Services; Hospitality; Human, Child and Family Development; Apparel, Fashion and Textile Services; Housing and Interiors; Consumer Economic; Management and Resources; or Family and Consumer Science Education
