A. Muslim Student Association (MSA) Budget Proposal & Request | 10 minutes (MSA Club President Adam Karim-Abdelaal | Information/Discussion/Action)

MSA President Adam Karim-Abdelaal will present a budget proposal for a request of \$500.

- MSA President Adam Karim-Abdelaal introduced himself and briefly explained what Ramadan was. Those who participate in Ramadan pray at certain times and go through religious fasting from sunrise to sunset.
- MSA had an event planned next Wednesday that is open for everyone to come together and pray. The location is yet to be decided, but it may be in one of the humanity building classrooms.
- They would like to request \$500, maybe \$400, for decorations and printing flyers. They still need to decide where to print the flyers. They would like to make the location as culturally accurate as they can. They would also buy big prayer mats that are estimated to be around \$20-30.
- Advisor Dean Barnard said that ASG cannot support funds for food since it will be considered a gift of public funds.
- They currently have around 35 members.
- The Vice President X. Ruiz motioned to approve to fund MSA \$400 for the purchase of flyers and decorations. Sen. Adam Halaseh seconded.
