To be eligible for a California Community College Baccalaureate Degree, students must complete a minimum of 36 units of general education, divided as follows:

- Lower Division General Education: 27 semester units
- Upper Division General Education: 9 semester units

All courses required for the major must be completed with a grade of 'C' or better or 'P' (pass) grade; 6 units in the major must be completed at SDCCD. A 2.0 GPA is required in the curriculum upon which the degree is based.

Baccalaureate Degree from an Institutionally Accredited Institution: Students who submit an official transcript showing they have earned a baccalaureate degree from an institutionally accredited institution will have satisfied the SDCCD lower division baccalaureate degree general education. Students who follow this pattern are not required to take additional lower-division general education courses.
