(Proposed) BACHELOR DEGREE GENERAL EDUCATION 2025-2026

To be eligible for a California Community College Baccalaureate Degree, students must complete a minimum of 36 units of general education, divided as follows:

- Lower Division General Education: 27 semester units
- Upper Division General Education: 9 semester units

All courses required for the major must be completed with a grade of 'C' or better or 'P' (pass) grade; 6 units in the major must be completed at SDCCD. A 2.0 GPA is required in the curriculum upon which the degree is based.

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* A SDCCD bachelor's degree is to total no less than **120 units**

*In Addition: students who *already hold* a traditional associate's degree (minimum 60 units), will still need 9 additional upper-division units, and 6 additional lower-division units from the general education, totaling 15 extra general education units

*SDCCD bachelor's degree students can seek **one** of the following pathways below for general education, depending on what better fits their educational goal and pathway:

1. **Current District General Education (Option 1):** current SDCCD students seeking *any* associate's degree

2. **(Proposed) Bachelor's Degree General Education (Option 4-BS):**

- SDCCD Bachelor's Degree-Seeking Students: This would be for students enrolled in SDCCD who aim to complete a bachelor's degree through SDCCD only.
- Students Who Already Hold an Associates' Degree: Those who have earned an associate's degree, either from SDCCD or another institution.

3. **Cal-GETC (California General Education Transfer Curriculum):** students who follow Cal-GETC, are following options to apply to any CSU, UC, Private Institution, or an SDCCD bachelor's degree. (*Students who follow this pattern are not required to take additional lower-division general education courses*)

4. **Baccalaureate Degree from an Institutionally Accredited Institution:** Students who submit an official transcript showing they have earned a baccalaureate degree from an institutionally accredited institution will have satisfied the SDCCD lower division baccalaureate degree general education. Students who follow this pattern are not required to take additional lower-division general education courses.
