Purpose:

The District Software Inventory and Approval Taskforce is a temporary committee established to develop, review, and evaluate a standardized process to follow when acquiring, managing, and approving software used to support local college and district initiatives related to instructional or administrative needs.

Scope of Work:

- 1. Develop a process for inventory of software across the district, "determining what we have."
- 2. Develop new workflow and approval process for software from the local colleges Standard Operating Procedure.
 - 2.1. Develop process to interface with and bring awareness to all constituency groups (Academic Senates, Classified Senate, Associated Students, Administration), and ensure the new process includes a communication stream with other similar committees within the district.
 - 2.2. Develop a process for sunsetting software packages that are obsolete or do not follow district or regulatory compliance rules.
 - 2.3. Ensure that accessibility standards are met in the software process. Please see Accessibility Capability Maturity Model (ACMM Goals and Milestones).
 - 2.4. Ensure all software meets FERPA, security, and regulatory compliance requirements.
- 3. Identify opportunities to consolidate similar software used at multiple locations to reduce costs and improve operational efficiency.
- 4. Explore the value of having a District Web Page with universal software resources.
- 5. Develop District-wide poll or data-gathering process for software needs, including guidelines on sharing results with colleges.
- 6. Recommend implementation of an annual process to review inventory and to stay current with the evolution of technology at the district.
