#### IV. New Business

# 1) Discussion: Focus/ charge of Student Success Committee

Martin initiated a discussion about the committee's focus and charge for the Student Success Committee. He mentioned that the committee was a combination of three previous committees (Student Services, Guided Pathways Steering and Academic Success) and aimed to support student success both inside and outside the classroom, while aligning with the college's mission. Then presented a document outlining the responsibilities of the previous committees, which included reviewing committees purpose/ charge and responsibilities. The committee also aimed to promote student satisfaction, equity, and success. Noting the importance of monitoring progress towards meeting the goals of the Guided Pathways initiative and supporting professional development efforts related to student access, success, equity, diversity, and inclusion. The conversation ended with a discussion about the merger of the Success in English. ELAC and Math committees into the Academic Success Committee. The committee also discussed the potential need for a work group to review policies and procedures coming from the district, and the importance of sharing data and feedback. The committee agreed to review their current charge and send any necessary recommendations to Martin and Julian. Reminder still in need of a tri-chair, Classified Professional for committee.

  - a) Student Journey / Milestone

## i. Review GP Student Journey at Miramar

Brewster discussed the student journey at Miramar College, emphasizing the importance of understanding the student's perspective and experience. She presented a merged student journey document, which was initially developed by the work group. The document outlines the student journey in four stages: Preparing to enroll (clarify the path), Beginning college classes (Enter the path), Successfully completing classes (Stay on the path), and Obtain a degree or certificate (ensuring learning and completion). Brewster also highlighted the need for students to familiarize themselves with academic and support resources available on campus and to join an ACP Canvas shell for support. Roberts suggested that the CRM could be used to guide students through each pathway, providing them with the necessary resources and information. Julian reminded the importance of aligning the student journey with the college's equity plan. The committee agreed to consider this as a working document and to further explore the "how" of implementing the student journey. All committee members to review and provide feedback on the student journey document by March 5th to Brewster. Brewster to update the student journey document with "draft" and a note about the Student Success Committee's ongoing work before submitting for the Planning Summit on March 14th.

- 4) Work-Based Learning (WBL) presentation

Baeza, the Work-Based Learning Coordinator at Miramar, discussed the importance of integrating work-based learning into the classroom to enhance student career readiness and success. She highlighted that work-based learning activities happening in the classroom have a more significant impact on student success than those solely provided outside of the class. She also mentioned that work-based learning can apply to any field and is not limited to technical or career-focused classes. She emphasized the need to collect more student voices, particularly from underrepresented groups, and to collaborate more with industry and community partners, especially in the arts, humanities, and social and behavioral sciences. Kunst suggested expanding work-based learning to student clubs and organizations.
