## President's Report: State, District, Campus, and Senate Issues Campus:

- 1. The Election Committee has a vacancy—if you are interested in serving out the rest of the term, through Fall 2025, please let me know now or our ConC Chair via email.
- 2. If you are teaching courses this summer, please see Lily Cava's 3/26/25 email, "Summer 2025 Course Materials Request" to ensure you submit your textbook and materials information as soon as possible.
- 3. The Student Success Committee's is discussing ways that they can help facilitate the dissemination of information as well as organize or coordinate the various efforts around college and committee goals. This might include:
  - a. "Front loading" efforts and initiatives (such as the Planning Summit and the Student Equity Plan) based on current campus initiatives and helping to disseminate and act on the results and recommendations of these events.
  - b. Asking committee chairs to identify goals that are communally reviewed at biannual "summits" hosted by the College Council. This could be implemented through an informal roll out in Spring 2025, with a very loose summit in Fall 2025, building toward a more formal summit in Spring 2026.

- 4. Our Equity History Story: "Equity is how we live out our mission." - matters as we develop our 2025-2028 Student Equity Plan! It's essential to consider past efforts to understand and plan for the next frontier in racial equity work.
