- xvi. 300-Hour Registered Yoga Teacher, CA (Program Revision)
- Need for proposal: Adjust restricted elective options to provide students more freedom/choice, while enhancing program to better meet industry standards. Restricted electives added: EXSC 251 and EXSC 286.
 - Restricted electives are being added with the approval of EXSC faculty, board, and governing body (Yoga Alliance).
 - These additional electives are ideal for students who are already working as yoga teachers.
 - MSC (Ela/Moller) to approve as presented. (0-Nayes, 0-Abstentions)

xvii. Personal Training, CA (Program Revision)

- Revision to program requirements. Removed EXSC 280/BIOL 235, EXSC 285 and EXSC 288 from courses required for the major. Moved EXSC 286 from courses required from the major to electives. Added two new courses to electives: EXSC 241B and EXSC 251. EXSC 270, EXSC 281 OR BIOL 230, EXSC 282, EXSC 283, and EXSC 284 OR NUTR 170 are still major requirements.
- Revision will reduce units required for the certificate, with the plan to increase potential work-study hours (current version is 16-24 units; revised will be 11-18). Private companies offer PT certificates that can be completed in a much shorter amount of time (sometimes as quickly as a weekend). The proposed revisions will help keep our program competitive.
- Escalante pointed out that certificates need to be at least 16 units to qualify for financial aid. The proposed change will disqualify the award from financial aid eligibility. There are likely to be issues with changing an award from financial aid eligible to non-eligible. The District does not recommend this change.
- Cain asked if we could get data on how many students have completed this certificate with and without financial aid. Cain requested to move the award forward at this time. He will communicate with District personnel regarding the financial aid issues, and if we need to pull or hold the award before it goes to CIC we can do so.

xviii. Exercise and Nutritional Science, AS (Program Revision)

- Need for proposal: Removal of EXSC 125 A-D, EXSC 147 A-D, EXSC 148 A-D, BIOL 135, and MATH 148 electives, updated PSYC to PSYC C1000, change in statistics course option to be either STAT C1000 or PSYC 258.
- MSC (Cain/Ela) to approve as presented. (0-Nayes, 0-Abstentions)

xix. FIPT 324E: ICS 300: Intermediate Incident Command System for Expanding Incidents (New Credit Course)

- Need for proposal: This course was updated by State Fire Training for 21 total student hours to comply with National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Standards.
- This is a stand-alone fire in-service course.

- MSC (Ela/Alsup) to approve as presented. (0-Nayes, 0-Abstentions)
- xx. FIPT 350A: Fire Officer 3A: Human Resource Management (New Credit Course)
- xxi. FIPT 350B: Fire Officer 3B: Finance and Administration (New Credit Course)
- xxii. FIPT 350C: Fire Officer 3C: Command of Expanding Incidents (New Credit Course)
 - The above three FIPT 350 courses were reviewed as a bundle.
 - Reason for proposed action: The FIPT 350 Chief Officer course was updated by State Fire Training and split into three 54 hour courses. This new course is required for promotion to the Chief Officer position. This change is in alignment with State Fire Training updates to the Fire Officer 3 Curriculum.
 - These are fire in-service courses for students seeking State Fire Training (SFT) Chief Officer certification.
 - MSC (Ela/Alsup) to approve as presented. (0-Nayes, 0-Abstentions)
- xxiii. FIPT 332D: Rope Rescue Awareness and Operations (New Credit Course)
 - Need for proposal: State Fire Training updated the original course from 24 hours to 40 hours. This course is included in the updated Lifeguard AS and COA programs.
 - This is a fire/lifeguard in-service course and is also included in the Lifeguard awards.
 - MSC (Ela/Moller) to approve as presented. (0-Nayes, 0-Abstentions)
- xxiv. FIPT 345C: Ethical Leadership for Instructors (New Credit Course)
 - Need for proposal: This course has been requested by the Advisory Committee and is required to teach in the fire academy or become a registered instructor for SFT.
 - This is a fire in-service course for students seeking to become qualified State Fire Training (SFT) Instructors.
 - MSC (Ela/Moller) to approve as presented. (0-Nayes, 0-Abstentions)
- xxv. FACD 100D: Fire Academy Preparation (Course Revision)
 - Need for proposal: Changed title and minor content to reflect the course updates. The course is being updated to be a required requisite for the Fire Academy.
 - Hall: all fire academy and fire academy prep courses are going under the new FACD designator effective Fall 2026.

 - Is a required course for the Fire Fighter Academy I certificate.

- xxvii. FACD 171: Fire Fighter 1B – Hazardous Materials (New Credit Course)
- xxviii. FACD 172: Fire Fighter 1C – Wildland Operations (New Credit Course)
- xxix. FACD 173: Firefighter 1 Academy Skills Review and Certification (New Credit Course)
- xxx. FACD 174: Common Vehicle Rescue Technician (New Credit Course)
- FACS 171-174 were reviewed as a bundle.
 - Need for proposals: Alignment with Model Curriculum accrediting body; State Fire Marshal/State Fire Training.
 - As initially presented, these courses had equivalencies to multiple FIPT courses. After discussion, it was decided that Hall would remove the stated equivalencies for the program. The corresponding FIPT courses, which will no longer be needed, will be phased out (deactivated) after this FACS series is implemented.

- xxxi. FACS 175: Fire Fighter 2A – Structural Firefighting (New Credit Course)
- Need for proposal: Alignment with Model Curriculum accrediting body; State Fire Marshal/State Fire Training.
 - This is a new, in-service, course that covers advanced fire fighting skills and Fire Fighter 2 Certification Exam testing
 - MSC (Ela/Alsup) to approve as presented. (0-Nayes, 0-Abstentions)
- xxxii. Fire Technology, AS (Program Revision)
- Need for proposal: Revisions to separate the Fire Technology Degree and the Fire Academy. The Fire Academy will now be offered as a standalone Certificate of Achievement in order to provide the COA at time of Fire Academy Graduation and align with National Fire and Emergency Services Higher Education Standards.

- After discussion, the committee decided to remove EMGM 50A (CPR for Health Care Providers) from both the AS and CA awards so that students will not have to file Credit for Prior Learning petitions if they already have CPR certifications. EMGM 50A is only a 0.1 unit course, so there is no major impact on the revised awards in terms of units.

xxxiii. Fire Technology, CA (Program Revision)

- Need for proposal: Revisions to separate the Fire Technology Degree and the Fire Academy. The Fire Academy will now be offered as a standalone Certificate of Achievement in order to provide the COA at time of Fire Academy Graduation and align with National Fire and Emergency Services Higher Education Standards.
- As above, EMGM 50A removed from the required course list.

xxxiv. Fire Fighter I Academy, CA (New Program)

- Need for proposal: Miramar College currently offers a fire academy. However, it resides as part of the theory-focused Fire Protection Technology program. Currently, the fire academy students only receive industry certifications, with no college certificate of completion when they graduate. To address this, the college is now aligning the existing fire academy instruction to the new California State Fire Training Fire Fighter 1 requirements, in the form of a separate certificate of achievement. This will produce college certificate completers for every student who completes the fire academy program and will meet the requirements of the accrediting bodies' new Fire Fighter 1 curriculum. The Fire Academy Program redesign will also help our student Veterans use their Veteran benefits, as the new courses will fit certificate requirements whereas our current curriculum does not.

- MATH 151L and 252L were reviewed as a bundle.
- Need for proposal: New courses at Miramar to support students enrolling in Calculus II/III

- Miramar currently offers a three-course calculus series (MATH 150, 151, and 252). These two new courses are supplemental labs to provide additional support to students in the latter two classes. They are not designed as learning communities, just optional labs.
 - We have an existing MATH 150L that supports students in Calculus I. When offered last fall, the section had low enrollment but received good feedback from students. Once MATH 151L and 252L are approved, they can be offered concurrently, increasing enrollment.

- Need for proposal: Students need MUSI 201 before taking the capstone courses 205a and then 205b. Making MUSI 201 a pre or co-requisite will enable students to be successful in their 205a projects which current 190 only pre-req students are struggling with since they have not had the proper training in the studio and on the equipment needed to be used.

Update to Program description.

 - Short and Fusco provided information on the Paralegal program, including the hiring of a new full-time faculty member and recent changes to the Paralegal CA (effective Fall 2025). They also highlighted industry changes, including an increased focus on electronic tools. The PARA department is working on revising their courses for better industry alignment, and to require PARA 105 as a prerequisite to emphasize research skills prior to entering writing courses.
 - Other PARA course will be worked on to incorporate these changes with a Fall 2027 effective date.
