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## 2025-2026 CALIFORNIA GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM (Cal-GETC)

**CERTIFICATION PATTERN** 

The California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) is a general education pattern that fulfills all lower-division general education requirements at all California State University (CSU) campuses and most University of California (UC) campuses/majors. It is also accepted by some private/independent or out of state universities. Cal-GETC is the recommended general education pathway for students who intend to transfer to a UC or CSU campus, or who are not yet sure of their intended transfer university.

Completion of the Cal-GETC pattern is not an admission requirement for transfer to most UC or CSU campuses, nor is it the only way to fulfill the lower division GE requirements of a UC or CSU campus prior to transfer. Please consult with a Counselor to determine the most appropriate general education pattern and requirements for transfer to a CSU or UC. This information is based on the 2025-2026 Miramar College Catalog. Consult the SDCCD District COLLEGE CATALOGS website for current catalogs and updates (including addenda and errata). Be advised some information can change with catalog updates during the year.

- To count toward certification, a course must have been Cal-GETC approved at the time it was taken. If a course was approved for IGETC before Cal-GETC existed, it may still count toward Cal-GETC - check with a Counselor to confirm, as specific approval dates may apply. Also, while some courses are approved for multiple Cal-GETC areas, each course can only be certified in one area.
- Coursework completed at accredited U.S. colleges and universities can be used to fulfill some Cal-GETC requirements. All such credit must be evaluated through the Evaluations office.
- All courses must be passed with a "C" or higher. "C-" is not acceptable.
- Cal-GETC may not be appropriate for some majors or schools at UC Campuses or for students who were previously enrolled at a UC campus.
- Some community college courses have limitations on the amount of credit awarded by the receiving university.
- Students may be eligible for transfer upon completion of the applicable 60 transferable units which must include GE courses. The balance of courses may be preparation for major and/or electives. See a counselor for details
- Acceptable scores on the Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate Credit (IB) exams may count towards satisfying some Cal-GETC subject areas. Please consult the College Catalog and a Counselor for details.
- Foreign coursework is not acceptable.
- No more than 14 semester units of Pass/No Pass (Credit/No Credit) may be used toward Cal-GETC certification.
