



Most students were employed













How did attending Miramar College impact graduates?




Broader education, thinking critically and analytically, and working effectively with others were the highest rated skills in development.

Most categories have modest to large increases since 2021.










Utilization of Career & Life Design Services has decreased. Use of the Counseling Office has increased slightly.











Utilization of the San Diego Promise Program and the Jet Fuel Food Pantry has increased significantly.








Mental Health Services and Student Health Services



Utilization of DSPS and Mental Health Services has increased since 2021.




College Hour Event on Campus, Student Affairs Office, Student Clubs & Orgs



Attendance of on-campus College Hour events and participation in Student Clubs & Organizations have grown significantly.




5 Year Average Utilization




Student Barriers


The most common barriers students reported were financial barriers, working while studying, family responsibilities/issues, and mental health issues.

Are graduates currently employed?




Most respondents reported being employed.

Employed graduates (full- and part-time) plan to...




58% of employed graduates plan to stay with their current employer (55% stay in same position, 3% seek promotion). 34% plan to seek a new employer (17% part-time, 17% full-time). 6% indicated that they will quit working.



Employment plans in the next six months


Non-working graduates plan to...

64% of graduates plan to transfer to a 4-year university.


16% plan to continue at community college (9% Miramar College, 7% another college).

Which of the following supports and services would be helpful to you as a graduate of Miramar College?




Graduates are most interested in alumni networking (44%) and on-campus career events (39%).

What types of alumni events would you be most likely to attend?




Graduates are most interested in career-related activities (61%) and skill development or certification courses (61%).
