- I. Call to Order
 - Meeting called to order at 11:33am by Co-chair Carrasquillo
- II. Approval of Agenda
 - MSC (Pacheco/Koch) to approve the agenda as presented. (0-Nays; 0-Abstentions)

- V. Action Items
 - [Standing Committee Report Form – Goals](#) (Carrasquillo)
 - The Committee reviewed a draft version of the form, based on discussions from previous meetings.
 - A fourth goal was added – to address the Land Acknowledgement in collaboration with the Native American Student Support & Success Program (NASSSP)

- Suggested language for this goal: “Revisit, uplift, and advocate for an inclusive land acknowledgement, in collaboration with NASSSP and in solidarity with native communities” or “Revisit and advocate for, in order to uplift, an inclusive land acknowledgement, in collaboration with NASSSP and in solidarity with native communities”
 - Objectives in support of this goal:
 - Include the land acknowledgement on IDEA agendas for the foreseeable future
 - Add NASSSP representative and other stakeholders to the discussion
 - Invite NASSSP to present to the Committee on their recently-submitted program plan
 - The Committee also agreed to append the phrase “with civility and respect” to goal #1, “increase collaboration with other groups”
 - MSC (Wolf/Koch) to approve submission of the committee report form for Fall 2025. (0-Nays; 0-Abstentions)
- Student Journey Map (Julian)
 - Julian provided an overview of the current Student Journey Map draft.
 - The information in the Map will undergo further vetting by students and will then be shared with the campus community. Eventually the steps will be incorporated into the Program Pathways Mapper.
 - The information will be formatted and shared in multiple context-specific ways, to help keep students from being overwhelmed with too much info.
 - Committee suggested one version of the map could be a “checklist” style, so students could mark off steps as they are completed.
- Event Proposals: Next Steps (Wilson)
 - Wilson reviewed the Committee’s new event funding process and presented a draft timeline to receive and review proposals for Spring 2026.
 - Feedback suggested making due dates on Fridays (or another consistent day) to make them easier to remember. Draft will be updated accordingly.
 - The draft will be emailed out to members. Please reach out with any suggestions, concerns, or ideas.

VI. Discussion Items

- Equity Summit Session on Cohort-based Learning (Carrasquillo)
 - This year’s Summit will incorporate interactive breakout sessions that are designed to yield ideas and input on equitable best practices.
 - One session will be on the topic of Cohort-based Learning (i.e., Umoja, Puente, and similar programs). In alignment with our Committee goals, IDEA members are encouraged to participate.
 - Two IDEA members will be facilitating, in addition to two counselors

 - The summit will offer different tracks for students, faculty, classified professionals, and administrators.

- Land Acknowledgement (Mangrum)
 - This topic will remain on the agenda for the foreseeable future, so we can keep discussing it throughout the semester.
 - One proposed revision has already been moved forward: *“San Diego Miramar College resides on the ancestral lands of the Kumeyaay, Luiseño, Cupeño, and Cahuilla tribes”*
