TRANSPORTATION

The MTS Transit Center allows students from all around San Diego to have access to our campus. For students who drive to campus, there are several parking lots and two structures to choose from.

Bus & Trolley Passes

Students who are enrolled in a minimum of 7 college units may purchase a monthly bus and trolley pass. The monthly bus and trolley passes are available at the Miramar Accounting office.

Access Via Car

Parking permits **are required** to park in all student lots. Student parking permits are available for purchase during registration on the mySDCCD portal. The parking permits are virtual and enforced via license plates.

Hourly and all-day parking permits may be purchased at the parking permit machines. **Virtual daily visitor/student parking permits** are available for purchase online using the ParkMobile app. The campus code is 21004.

● COLLEGE TERMS TO KNOW

College lingo can feel a little overwhelming, so let's go over some common terms and definitions. These terms will provide a better idea of what you may encounter throughout your journey at Miramar College.

Add a Class

After submitting an application, you will receive an appointment each semester to register for your classes.

Add Code/ Permission number

A 6-digit code issued by the professor to add a desired class on or after the start of the semester/session or for a restricted class. It is processed by the student through the mySDCCD portal prior to the add deadline.

Advisories

Departmental recommendations to be completed prior to enrolling in the course. This does not prevent a student from enrolling in a class.

California Dream Act

Application to apply for financial aid for undocumented and non-resident students. Awards may consist of state and private-funded loans and scholarships.

Canvas

A platform used by SDCCD to provide online classes at all campuses. Use your 10-Digit Student ID and your date of birth to login. Courses appear on the dashboard the first day of class.

Certificate of Achievement/ Performance

Awarded for the completion of the core requirements in vocational majors.

Certificates do not require completion of general education or district requirements.

Closed Class

The class is closed to further enrollment when a course has reached the maximum capacity of student registration.

Class Number (CN)

The 5-Digit course number that identifies each class section for the semester. Required for registration.

Corequisites

Courses that are required to be taken the same semester as another course.

Drop a Class

You may officially drop a class through mySDCCD portal. A dropped class will not be reflected on an official transcript if dropped before deadline.

Full-Time vs. Part-time Student

A full-time student is enrolled in at least 12 units in a semester. A part-time student is enrolled in less than 12 units.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Application to apply for financial aid for U.S. citizens. Awards may consist of grants, work-study, loans and scholarships.

● COLLEGE TERMS TO KNOW – CONT.

Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC)

A general education pattern that will fulfill all lower-division general education requirements at all CSU campuses and most UC campuses.

Loan vs. Grant

Both are forms of financial aid that can be used to pay for tuition, books, and other school related expenses.

The difference: A loan is money that you must pay back. A grant is free money that you do not have to pay back.

Major

A pattern of courses within a specific area of study. Majors for the Associate degree require a minimum of 18 units.

MySDCCD Portal

The SDCCD Portal is the platform where students view registration date/time, enroll for classes, view payments, and find important deadlines. Allows access to the student's personal student database.

Prerequisites

Courses that must be completed with a "C" or better prior to registration in a specific course.

Tuition/Enrollment Fees

Cost per unit a student is enrolled in, this does not include books or supplies. This is different for in-state residents and out-of-state students.

Withdrawal

Occurs when a student drops a course after the drop deadline. You must officially withdraw through SDCCD prior to the withdrawal deadline. Withdrawals will be reflected on your official transcript with a 'W.'

ENROLLMENT STEPS — FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

STEP 1 — Apply

What is CCCApply?

An admissions application site for California Community Colleges, where students need to complete an account in order to complete the college application.

Does Miramar College provide a college email account?

Yes. Starting June 28th, 2023, student will be able to receive a college email address. In order to receive a college email address, You, the student, will need to register in at least 1 unit. Around 2 hours after registering, you will receive an email about it in your personal email address' inbox.

How do I know if I submitted an application?

Search your email inbox (and spam) for the SDCCD welcome email. Within 48 hours after the welcome email, you will receive an SDCCD account set up email. If you can't find the emails you may have not submitted one. You can also follow up with the Admissions Office for more information.

What if I never received my college ID number?

Go to the mySDCCD Support Desk, select the Help Desk Topic: "I don't know my student ID," and enter your information to submit a help ticket. Please note, it will require verification of identity. For questions about this process, please email miraadm@sdccd.edu.

I have a CCCApply ID number, is this my college ID number?

No, in order to receive a 10-digit college ID, you must complete the Miramar College application. If you have a CCCApply ID it means you created a CCCApply account and it looks something like "BW12345".

When will I receive my college ID number?

Students should receive their college ID number within 24 hours via email after completing the college application. Student ID's are 10-digits, no letters, for example, 0001234567 or 5550001234.

Where can I get my physical Student ID?

*Students can pick up their **physical student ID cards** at the Office of Admissions once they enroll. For free!

How do I submit transcripts to SDCCD?

Students should submit official transcripts from all Colleges and Universities attended. All transcripts and AP/IB scores need to be submitted directly to the district, not the campus.

Please review the Miramar Evaluations page or the District transcript page for details on each process.



ENROLLMENT STEPS — FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (CONT.)

STEP 1 — Apply (Cont.)

**If I apply to Miramar College,
can I only take classes at Miramar?**

No! Students are allowed to take classes at any of our SDCCD campuses, which include City and Mesa College.



**Is there a site where I can view all
the steps to set up mySDCCD
Account, Student Email and
Microsoft 365?**

Yes! Remember, within 24 hours, you will receive a welcome SDCCD email with your 10-digit college ID number.

Once you receive your confirmation email with your SDCCD ID, set up your MySDCCD account to access your Student Email and Microsoft 365 with a single login (SSO). Click [MySDCCD Account](#) to find frequently asked questions, support desk information and the steps to support you along the way. This information is also provided again on page 11 of this guide.

**What is Multi-factor Authentication
(MFA)?**

A core component of a strong identity and access management. MFA is an authentication method that requires you to provide two or more verification factors to gain access to an application or online account such as Microsoft 365.

ENROLLMENT STEPS — FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (CONT.)

STEP 2 — Financial Aid

Do I need to complete both FAFSA & Dream Act applications?

No, you only need to complete one. It depends on your citizenship/residency status.

- You are eligible to complete the FAFSA at fafsa.gov if you are a: U.S Citizen, Permanent Resident, Eligible non-citizen, or T Visa holder.
- You are eligible to complete the CADAA at dream.csac.ca.gov if you are: Undocumented, Have a valid or expired DACA, U Visa holders, or Have Temporary Protected Status (TPS). 🦋

Does Miramar offer scholarships?

Yes! SDCCD offers scholarships on a yearly basis. For more information, visit the [Miramar Scholarship office](#).



How long does it take to process my financial aid application?

Application processing may take 4–6 weeks. If required, you will be notified via email by the Financial Aid Office if additional information is needed, which may delay processing further. For more information and to chat with staff, visit the [Miramar Financial Aid website](#).



STEP 3 — Online Orientation

What is the Online Orientation?

The Online Orientation provides students general information about the programs and resources offered at San Diego Miramar College. It takes approximately 45 minutes to 1-hour to complete. Time varies per student.

How do I receive credit for completing the online orientation?

Complete the survey at the end and receive credit within 72 hours. Please enter your 10-digit college ID, this is not to be confused with a high school ID.



ENROLLMENT STEPS — FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (CONT.)

STEP 4 — Student Education Plan (SEP)

What's the purpose of an SEP?

It stands for Student Educational Plan. It's a plan/outline of classes developed with the help of a counselor students should follow based on their educational/professional goal.

It's important to receive this before enrolling so that you register into the appropriate classes & follow the requirements needed for you to transfer, receive your degree/certificate, or accomplish your goal.

I am a new student, how do I schedule a counseling appointment?

Visit the [Counseling Office website](#) and click on New Students. Ensure you have completed all the prior enrollment steps and criteria before scheduling.

Students may experience a “fully booked” notice, in which case, you will need to follow up the following morning or week for open appointments or use the other drop-in features on their page.

When can I request to speak with a counselor?

You can schedule a counseling appointment as soon as you have your 10-digit college ID number. It's best to speak with them sooner rather than later so you can receive an educational plan to know which classes to enroll in and become connected to campus resources.

Is there anything I need to know before my first counseling appointment?

Your counselor is going to ask you some important questions, like the ones listed below. Don't worry if you're undecided, our counselors are there to guide and support you through your process at Miramar.

- Do you know what your major is going to be?
- Are you planning to transfer, and if so, to which school(s)?
- Are you planning to get an Associate Degree, which one?

STEP 5 — mySDCCD Portal

What is the SDCCD Portal?

The SDCCD Portal is the platform where students view their registration date/time, enroll for classes, view payments, and find important deadlines.

How do I change my password and security questions?

Contact the Help Desk by clicking here for login help.

How do I set up mySDCCD account?

The link to the mySDCCD portal will be sent to the email address you submitted in the college application. If you haven't received an email, check if your application was submitted by contacting the Admissions Office at miraadmesdccd.edu.

Once you receive your confirmation email with your SDCCD ID, **set up your MySDCCD account to access your Student Email and Microsoft 365 with a single login.** Click MySDCCD Account to get started.



STEP 6 — Enroll

Where can I find my registration date and time?

You can find your date/time on your mySDCCD portal college student dashboard under "My Classes".

Here is a video tutorial on How to Register for Classes!

I can't sign up for a class because of a prerequisite, how do I know if I fulfilled those requirements?

On the mySDCCD portal, click on the class, under Enrollment Information, there will be a list of prerequisites. If you have fulfilled the requirements, follow the process of clearing prerequisites found on the prerequisite page.

I have a hold on my account, where do I go to find what the hold is?

On your mySDCCD portal, go to the left hand tab, click My Personal Information, then Holds, and see hold details.

For additional hold questions, contact the Admissions Office at miraadmesdccd.edu.

A class is asking for a permission number, where can I find one?

You will need to contact the professor for the course that you are trying to enroll into to obtain one. Click here for Campus Directory. Then follow the instructions found on the mySDCCD help videos here.

SUCCESS TIPS FOR COLLEGE

1: Enroll in classes on your given registration date!

Your registration date should be in your mySDCCD portal or emailed to you. Waiting too long could result in fewer classes being available.

2: Pay attention to class details!

When looking for a class to enroll in, some classes are only 8 weeks instead of the full 16, so you want to pay attention and check the date and time it starts. Also make sure you know whether it's online or in-person.

3: Utilize free academic tutoring!

Miramar College, and the other colleges in the SDCCD, offers students free [Academic Success Center](#) for multiple subjects including math, English and science classes!

4. Join the Student Support Hub

Canvas Shell! Once you add a Miramar class, you will be able to access a Student Support Canvas Shell that provides students easy access to frequently requested information and services.



5: Get engaged!

In the campus and in your class! There are so many campus events that happen throughout the semesters! These event are full of helpful and useful information to help you succeed as a student, make friends, and stay involved on campus!

6: Utilize free mental health care!

Sometimes the course load, life and work can be draining. That is why we offer free mental health resources and services! Reach out for support and help! Add their [Mental Health Canvas page](#) to your Canvas Dashboard.

7: Be aware of all deadlines for the semester!

Deadlines are very important to be up to date with. Utilize a planner or reminder system. Being aware of these deadlines could help you avoid stress. [Review dates & deadlines here.](#)

8: Transferring starts day 1!

If you are looking to transfer to a 4-year institution, it's never too early to meet with a counselor to discuss the process. To access services and receive important announcements add the [Transfer Canvas page](#) to your Canvas Dashboard.

9: Don't be afraid to be your authentic self!

In college you are able to be who you set out to be, and work towards becoming the person you want to see in this world. You're on a journey other people dream about, do your best to be your best and that's all anybody is asking for. Get out of your comfort zone because it's time to walk your own path!

How to pay for college

FAFSA

- Application opens every October 1
- Must be completed on a yearly basis
- Applies to federal & state grants, work study, and loans

Dream Act

- Application opens every October 1
- Must be completed on a yearly basis
- Applies to state-funded & private scholarships

DO'S

- Fill out your application early even if you think you're not eligible for any aid
- Double-check your answers
- Write down your FAFSA/ Dream Act password & login information

DONT'S

- **Don't** send your application to only one school. You can choose up to 10 you are interested in.
- **Don't** enter the wrong school code. Double check the code before submitting.
- **Don't** assume submitting an application is the last step. Important emails may be sent to you after submission to request additional documents or actions.

Forms of Aid

- Grants
 - Need-based
 - Based on your FAFSA/Dream Act application

- Miramar Annual Scholarship Drive
 - When does it take place?
 - Mid-late Fall semester - Beginning of Spring semester
 - Merit-based (*some may require some level of need)
 - Deadlines & application dates vary for each scholarship - be sure to check out the [Miramar Scholarship office](#) for updates.



- Federal Work Study (FWS)
 - Allows you to earn part of your financial aid by working an assigned job (on-campus or off-campus)
 - Eligibility is determined by your FAFSA application as it's based on financial need. Ensure you answer yes to the question that asks if you are interested in FWS!
 - Receive paycheck once a month.

SAN DIEGO PROMISE PROGRAM



The San Diego Promise (Not to be confused with the *California College Promise Grant, CCPG*) is a two-year completion program designed to ensure students complete their educational goal. Whether it be to earn a certificate of completion and enter the workforce, complete an associate degree, or transfer to a university.

Benefits

- Up to two years of free tuition and health fees
- Book grants for eligible students (based on financial need)
- Access to Peer Mentors/Retention Counselors
- Individualized counseling and guidance support to help you complete your educational goals

Eligibility

- Must be a first-time college student OR identify with one of the following groups:
 - Foster Youth Student
 - Veteran of U.S. Armed Forces
 - Formerly Incarcerated Student
 - Undocumented Student
- OR be a returning SDCCD student (did not take classes in any SDCCD campus for at least 3 semesters)
- Must be in the recent high school graduating class (H.S. Diploma or GED)
- Must be a California resident or AB 540 eligible
- Must enroll in and maintain a minimum of 12 units each semester
- Must maintain a 2.0 college GPA

***Unit requirement does not apply to DSPS students with eligible academic accommodation**

Apply

- 1) Apply to SDCCD: Complete an admissions application to Miramar, Mesa, or City
- 2) Complete a FAFSA/Dream Act Application (ensure Miramar is entered as your #1 school)
- 3) Complete a Promise application
- 4) Complete the Miramar Onboarding process at www.sdmiramar.edu/future-student
- 5) Attend a Promise Orientation & sign your Promise contract

Requirements

- Enroll in 12 units each fall and spring semester
- Maintain a 2.0 GPA
- Complete a comprehensive education plan by the end of the first year
- Participate in a campus engagement event

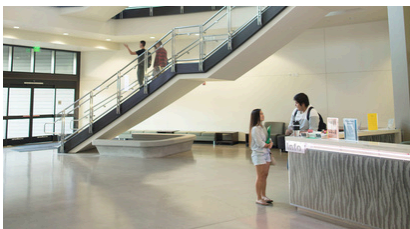
