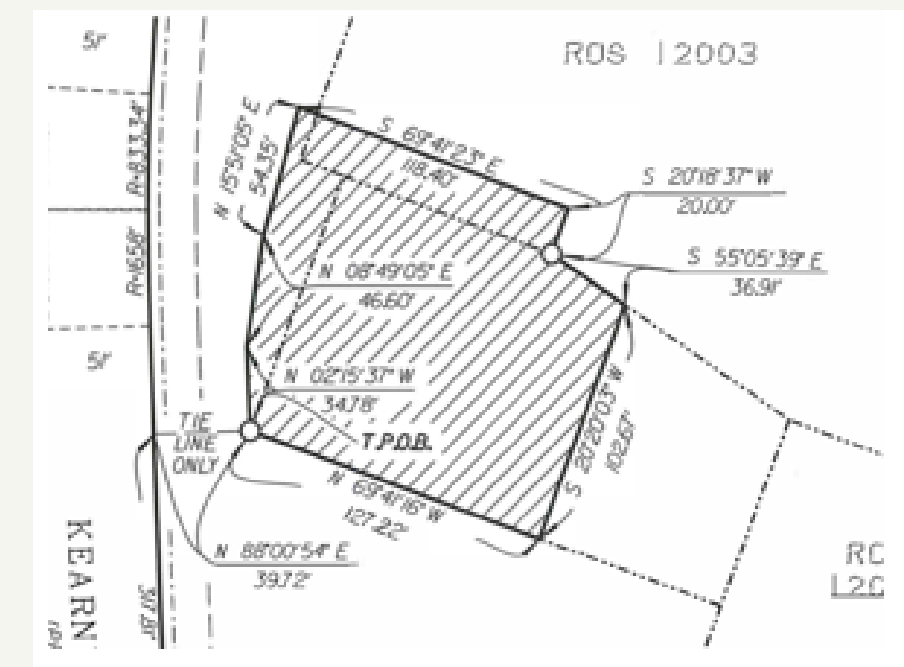
Building tomorrow, today

Montgomery Field Aviation Instructional Center

Scope:

- Replaces the existing 6,300 SF facility with a new 18,000 SF instructional center
- Supports expanded aviation workforce training with modern technology, climate control, and advanced instructional equipment
- Improves safety and instructional quality for students and faculty
- Includes site upgrades: new utilities, walkways, accessible parking, landscaping, and signage
- Swing space needs are anticipated and will be identified & addressed with campus input during the design process.
- Programming began at the end of September 2025.
- Site logistics, such as swing space, to be discussed during the design phase.

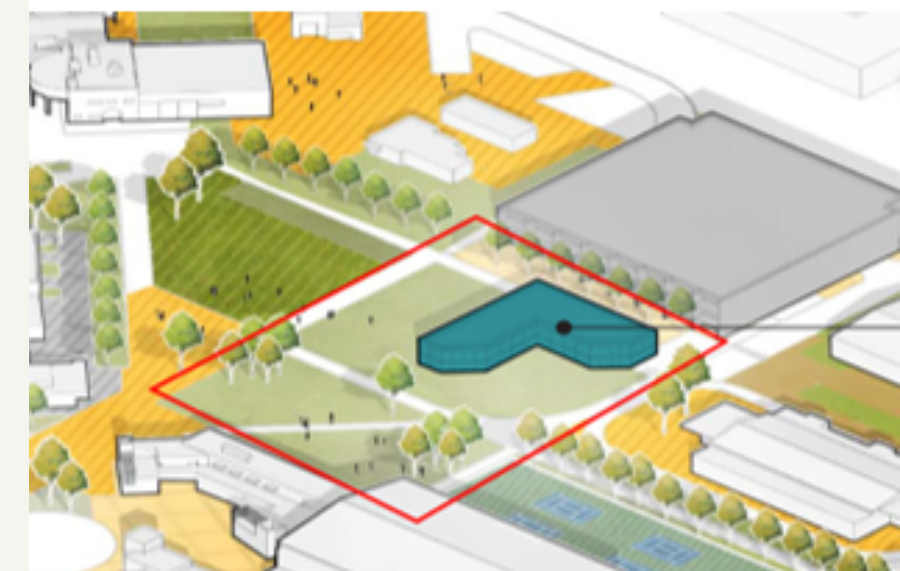


Early Education Center

Scope:

- Replaces existing CDC to support growing demand for early childhood education
- Includes interactive play areas, outdoor learning zones, infant care room and secure drop-off area
- Enhances campus connectivity with relocated roadways, new landscaping, pathways, and signage
- Swing space needs are not anticipated for this project.
- Programming began at the end of September 2025.
- Site logistics, such as parking, to be discussed during the design phase.

Performing Arts Center & English/Gallery Building

Scope:

- Replace an outdated lecture hall with classrooms, writing labs, multimedia studios, and a public gallery
- A stagecraft and performance venue will include a large lecture hall, advanced AV systems, and flexible event space for both academic programs and community events
- Major site improvements and demolition of part of Lot 2
- Once complete, this facility will serve as a cultural gateway to the campus
- Swing space needs are not anticipated for this project.
- Programming began at the end of September 2025.
- Site logistics, such as parking, to be discussed during the design phase.
