	Barnard shared Student Health Services and Mental Health will not be providing assistance via
	zoom. Financial Aid is adjusting well with the transition. ASG is holding weekly meetings.
	Feria shared the Accounting department is providing assistance to students via email.
	Foundation is in the process of figuring out how to set-up website to accept donations for
	COVID-19 relief for students.
	Griggs shared the Child Development Center is closed for the remaining of the school year.
	Kids will be in zoom sessions with their teachers.
	Webley stated counselors are providing assistance to students via email. Some of the topics
	they as assisting with are withdrawals, refunds, resources, incoming students and planning for
	summer and fall. Counseling is also providing assistance to instructional faculty.
	Nelson insured the Counseling department was devising a plan for hourly employees to assist
	with preparation for summer and fall 2020 registration.
	Demcho shared EOPS is conducting their counseling online. Department created an online
	form where students can request to meet with a counselor. Will be transitioning to case
	management model to best assist students. Have provided additional grants to qualifying
	students.
	Garduno additionally pointed out the EOPS department transition has gone well.
	McLemore shared the Transfer Center is offering workshops and one-on-one appointments
	via zoom. Workshops include university appeal process and next steps/ updates. Counselors
	are available via email. Daily updates on canvas with the most recent university information
	is available to students.
	Eng shared the Student Health Center phone lines are open and available to students during
	normal business hours. Have ability to renew prescriptions.

Stack shared Admissions and Records employees have transitioned well.

Marine pointed out the Police Academy is currently on hold, waiting for further direction from the County on how they plan to proceed.

S. Patel shared ASG is still holding weekly meetings and will be focused on student centered projects during the months of April and May.

Teresh pointed out as many resources are currently being offered to conduct work under these new circumstances, we all need to be mindful in the decisions we make and determining what is worth investing long-term.

2) District / Campus Updates

Grading Policies: Gonzales shared that State Chancellor Oakley released some updates to policies that were previously enforced. These include restrictions on excused withdrawals and pass/no pass options and refunds. Due to this, the district has extended deadlines for spring 2020. If a student withdrawals from a course during spring 2020, they will automatically receive an excused withdrawal (EW) and it will be coded "covid-19" on their transcript. As the pass/ no pass deadline was extended students are recommended to get guidance from their counselor to determine their best option based on academic goal and school they may potentially be transferring to. A general recommendation for students is they should only select the pass/ no pass option if it is absolutely needed. The college is additionally looking at potentially providing the pass/no pass option to all courses offered in spring 2020. Still reviewing the impact excused withdrawals will have on financial aid, waiting for federal guidelines.

Emergency Resources: 300 laptops will be provided to students for use. Projected to distribute next week. An informational email will be sent out to students, along with the application process.

CARES Act will provide students with some financial relief. Currently awaiting for final allocation for college and guidance on how to distribute. Students will not have to pay back the funds they receive.

Planning Virtual Student forum to provide students with a general overview of updates. Will be on Friday, April 17 from 1:00 – 2:00p.m.

JIRA program has launched, it is an online system to assist with processing student petitions.

3) CAGP Application Status

The college applied and was approved for a Guided Pathways Grant – Cohort #II. The grant will provide access to webinars, mentors and offsite trainings. There will be an interview with GP leads to identify best support efforts for campus. Brewster and Gonzales will send out additional information to the campus when it is available. The grant is led by National Center for Inquiry and Improvement.
