P. Martin stated that the above courses will be undergoing a change to the 4-letter subject descriptor. The previous descriptor of 'ARTD' shall be changed into 'GFRX'. W. Sherman asked to review GFRX 160, and stated that he was not clear on the meaning of the word "integrity" in the 4th sentence of the Student Learning Outcomes. Committee members shared they believed the word integrity (as used in the subject discipline) meant the integrity and or fidelity of the file would remain the same through different formats. P. Hopkins asked how long it would be before the courses could be placed on the college schedule with the new subject descriptors. M. Sanft answered that the Course Curriculum Report (CR) stated the revision to be effective Fall 2017. *Approved*. MSC W. Sherman/R. Boyd

i) PSYC 259 Behavioral Science Statistics Laboratory

W. Sherman asked why a CID -Math 110 was stated on the Course Outline Report (CO). M. Sanft asked to see the CO For PSYC 258 to see if it had a similar statement. When the CO for PSYC 258 was reviewed, the committee found the course also had a similar statement of CID-Math 110. I. Feldman stated she was also unclear on why the course would include the CID-Math 110 statement. M. Sanft shared that it is on the course CO because the district chose to include it to denote 2-way articulation between colleges and universities. M. Sanft further stated that Math 110 is a descriptor found on the CID website; the descriptor does not specify a specific Math 110 course at a specific college. M. Sanft shared that CID is a template for courses which prescribes the minimum content colleges must include in a course; colleges can decide to include more than the minimum content, but cannot include less than the minimum content. R. Boyd added that evaluators may use it to determine credits. W. Sherman expressed concern that the descriptor may mislead or fool students into believing that they are fulfilling a requirement when they are not in fact doing so. W. Sherman further stated that there should be a clear explanation of how the district is using these CID numbers. M. Sanft stated that they are similar to CAN (sp?). P. Hopkins asked whose decision it was to include CID numbers in COs and if the decision could be changed. M. Sanft responded that it was a district decision, and that it could be changed. M. Sanft further stated that both PSYC 258 and PSYC 259 should share the same descriptor because PSYC 258 or PSYC 259 by themselves are not equal (do not articulate) to Math 110, but PSYC 258 and PSYC 259 together are equal (do articulate) to Math 110. P. Hopkins asked if CID is looked at, R. Boyd responded that sometimes the CID descriptor is looked at and that CID is only relevant in the state of California. I. Feldman asked if CID descriptors are used by private universities, M. Sanft answered that the descriptors are designed for Cal State Universities (CSUs). W. Sherman motioned to approve the course with the clarification that PSYC 258 and PSYC 259 are taken in conjunction with each other, and that the language for the use of the CID descriptor is addressed to state "completion or concurrent enrollment in".
