



RESPONDENT CHARACTERISTICS


Q1. Part-time and Full-time




Q3. Enough Time to Dedicate to the Classes

Q4. Educational Goal *



RESPONDENT CHARACTERISTICS RESEARCH FINDINGS

- In Spring 2017, a total of 635 surveys went out to 29 randomly selected classes and 559 students responded to the survey, yielding a response rate of 89%.
- More than half of the survey respondents were currently taking 11 or more units as full-time students (55%), and had accumulated 16 or more units (64%).
- Over two-thirds of the respondents felt that they had enough time to dedicate to the classes (79%).
- Nearly one-third of the survey respondents selected 4-year college student as their educational goal (31%), followed by graduate/professional school (22%), certificate/license maintenance (16%) and AA/AS without transfer (15%).

COMMUNICATION




- Q5. In my experience at Miramar College, I have developed communication skills through interactions with instructors and/or other staff members in and out of the classroom.
- Q6. My experience at Miramar College has encouraged communication between myself and other students in and out of the classroom.
- Q7. On average, how many times have you engaged in a writing assignment per semester?
- Q8. The courses I have taken at Miramar College have improved my communication skills.

COMMUNICATION RESEARCH FINDINGS

- The majority of the survey respondents (73%) believed that their interactions with instructors and/or other staff members in and out of the classroom had helped them develop communication skills. More than one-fifth (22%) were not sure if the interactions helped.
- More than two-thirds (77%) reported that their experience at Miramar College had encouraged communication with other students in and out of the classroom.
- Less than half (42%) reported that they engaged in a writing assignment five or more times per semester.
- A large portion of the respondents (70%) felt that the courses that they had taken at Miramar College had improved their communication skills. One-quarter of the respondents (25%) were uncertain about the theme.

CRITICAL THINKING & PROBLEM SOLVING




- Q9. The courses I have taken at Miramar College have helped me make informed decisions in my everyday life.
- Q10. In my course(s), I have had information presented to me, and I had to analyze the information for content or purpose.
- Q11. In my course(s), I have used evidence to reinforce a conclusion on a particular topic.
- Q12. The use of interviews and/or observations was required in one or more of my courses.
- Q13. The courses I have taken at Miramar College have helped me use problem-solving strategies in my everyday life.

CRITICAL THINKING & PROBLEM SOLVING RESEARCH FINDINGS

- A large portion of the respondents perceived that the courses they had taken at Miramar College had helped them make informed decisions (68%) and use problemsolving strategies (71%) in their everyday life. Nearly onequarter (25% on average) of the respondents felt uncertain about the helpfulness of the courses with decision making or problem-solving.
- The vast majority (91% on average) reported that they analyzed information for content or purpose and used evidence to reinforce a conclusion on a particular topic. Over two-thirds (72%) reported that the use of interviews and/or observations was required in one or more of the courses they took.

QUANTITATIVE & INFORMATION LITERACY




- Q14. The courses I have taken at Miramar College have helped me use mathematical concepts in my everyday life.
- Q15. From my coursework at Miramar College, I feel that I can retrieve information from a variety of sources in order to make informed decisions in my everyday life.
- Q16. On average, how many times have you researched a topic per semester?

QUANTITATIVE & INFORMATION LITERACY RESEARCH FINDINGS

- Over half (54%) of the respondents felt that the courses they had taken at Miramar College had helped them use mathematical concepts in their everyday life with more than one-third (36%) perceiving uncertainty.
- Over three-quarters (78%) reported that they felt that the coursework they did at Miramar College helped them retrieve information to make informed decisions in their everyday life. Over a quarter (28% on average) reported researching a topic 4-6 times or 10 or more times per semester.

SAMPLE QUESTIONS RESEARCH FINDINGS

- The majority of the respondents answered the problem solving question and the information literacy questions correctly (74% and 88%, respectively).
- Most of the respondents (87%) provided wrong answer to the quantitative literacy question. The distribution of the answers showed that most of the respondents were attracted by multiple choice options a or b.
