Future Firefighters Put to the Test at Miramar College

Our state-of-the-art Fire Technology and Emergency Medical Technology facility will serve as a Candidate Physical Ability Testing (CPAT) center thanks to a \$44,000.00 Neighborhood Reinvestment Program Grant provided by the County of San Diego. Previously, firefighter candidates had to travel to Orange County or Sacramento to undergo their mandatory CPAT training. The Firefighter Candidate Testing Center (FCTC), the agency that administers the CPAT examinations, has also selected Miramar College as the state's third testing site.

The Neighborhood Reinvestment Program Grant will allow for the purchase of vital equipment necessary to successfully prepare local firefighting candidates.

San Diego Fire Chief Brian Fennessy, CalFire Unit Chief Tony Meacham, San Diego County Supervisor Dave Roberts, Yvonne de la Pena, executive director of the Firefighter Candidate Testing Center, and George Beitey, dean of the School of Public Safety at Miramar College gathered to make the announcement at a March 15 news conference on campus.
