Commencement 2017

The College held its 2017 commencement ceremony on May 19 with 246 students participating in the 41st annual ceremony. A capacity crowd witnessed the commencement exercises, which were held inside Hourglass Fieldhouse on the Miramar College campus.

This year, the College conferred 871 associate degrees, an increase of 15% from a year ago when 758 associate degrees were conferred. Another 469 Certificates of Achievement were earned this year.









Veronica Hughes, 31, delivered a heart-warming commencement address to her fellow graduates. The mother of three from Poway spoke of her time living in her Nissan as she struggled to support her 3 children. The New Student/Parent Open House was again a huge success! In its third year, the event drew another 200 future students and their parents to campus on May 3.




Excellence in Planning
