Miramar College Veterans Celebrate

Miramar College celebrated Veterans Day with a food distribution featuring members of the Student Veterans Organization and the Chemistry Affiliate. Over 50 meals were given out to students! Casey Porter, president of SVO, put together a short video featuring campus staff and faculty thanking our Veterans for their service and sacrifice. The video can be viewed **here**.

After crunching the numbers provided in this year's district facts of file, Miramar College educated 875 students who identified as a Veteran during the 2019-2020 academic year. Another 522 active duty military and 974 military dependents/spouse took classes at the college during the same time period.

first-generation to college experience. Celebrating the first-gen accomplishments of our staff and faculty provided students at Miramar College with motivation and a community of shared experiences.


Faculty and staff were asked to share a short video introducing themselves and explaining what being a first-generation student meant to them.
