Chancellor's Forum



Dr. Constance Carroll visited campus on September 19 for the annual Chancellor's Forum. She discussed issues affecting the District and plans for the future. The Chancellor reminded everyone how the fiscal picture for the upcoming budget year is good. She pointed out that the District is the 12th largest employer in the County of San Diego and produces the second largest FTES in the state at 44,578. She stated the goal is to get Miramar College to 10,000 FTES as fast as possible.

Brent King Visits Campus

Brent King, the father of Chelsea King, addressed Administration of Justice students on campus on Friday, Sept. 23. King discussed the impact of Chelsea's Law



and the state of sexual assault legislation. His 90-minute discussion took place in L-105.

Chelsea King, a 17-year old Poway High School student, was murdered on Feb. 25, 2010 after setting out for a run near Lake Hodges. Her killer was a convicted sex offender. As a result, King helped author legislation that would strengthen sentencing laws for sex offenses and provide more oversight for offenders on parole. According to King, since its passage in Sept. of 2010, over 600 people have been convicted under Chelsea's Law in California.

Campus Construction Update

Now that the Fall semester is off and running, we have closed the Miramar College Drive entrance effective September 21, 2016. Originally this closure was scheduled for 9/2 and we received a small grace period. This closure will remain in effect until the beginning of December 2016.
